AN ACT

1 RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES; AMENDING SECTION 49-306, IDAHO CODE, TO RE-  
2 VISE PROVISIONS REGARDING FEES; AMENDING SECTION 49-306, IDAHO CODE, AS  
3 AMENDED BY SECTION 2, CHAPTER 216, LAWS OF 2017, TO REVISE PROVISIONS  
4 REGARDING FEES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.  
5

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

7 SECTION 1. That Section 49-306, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby  
8 amended to read as follows:

9 49-306. APPLICATION FOR DRIVER'S LICENSE, INSTRUCTION PERMIT,  
10 COMMERCIAL LEARNER'S PERMIT OR RESTRICTED SCHOOL ATTENDANCE DRIVING PER-  
11 MIT. (1) Every application for any instruction permit, restricted school  
12 attendance driving permit, or for a driver's license shall be made upon a  
13 form furnished by the department and shall be verified by the applicant be-  
14 fore a person authorized to administer oaths. Officers and employees of the  
15 department and sheriffs and their deputies are authorized to administer the  
16 oaths without charge. Every application for a permit, extension or driver's  
17 license shall be accompanied by the following fee, none of which is refund-  
18 able:

- 19 (a) Class A, B, C (4-year) license with endorsements --
- 20 age 21 years and older .....\$40.00
- 21 (b) Class A, B, C (3-year) license with endorsements --
- 22 age 18 to 21 years .....\$30.00
- 23 (c) Class A, B, C (1-year) license with endorsements --
- 24 age 20 years .....\$15.00
- 25 (d) Class D (3-year) license -- under age 18 years ..... \$25.00
- 26 (e) Class D (3-year) license -- age 18 to 21 years ..... \$25.00
- 27 (f) Class D (1-year) license -- age 17 years or age 20 years .....\$15.00
- 28 (g) Four-year Class D license -- age 21 years and older .....\$30.00
- 29 (h) Eight-year Class D license -- age 21 to 63 years .....\$55.00

6 (2) Every application shall state the true and full name, date of birth,  
 7 sex, declaration of Idaho residency, Idaho residence address and mailing ad-  
 8 dress, if different, of the applicant, height, weight, hair color, and eye  
 9 color, and the applicant's social security number as verified by the social  
 10 security administration. If an applicant has submitted an application pur-  
 11 suant to the provisions of chapter 58, title 19, Idaho Code, then the appli-  
 12 cant may state, in his or her application pursuant to this section, the ap-  
 13 plicant's alternative Idaho mailing address in place of his or her Idaho res-  
 14 idence address and mailing address. Notwithstanding the provisions of sec-  
 15 tion 49-303(13), Idaho Code, an applicant for a nondomiciled class A, B or  
 16 C driver's license or nondomiciled commercial learner's permit having res-  
 17 idency in a state that is prohibited from issuing class A, B or C driver's  
 18 licenses or commercial learner's permits, as provided in 49 CFR 384, is ex-  
 19 cepted from providing proof of Idaho residency and an Idaho mailing address.

20 (a) The requirement that an applicant provide a social security number  
 21 as verified by the social security administration shall apply only to  
 22 applicants who have been assigned a social security number.

23 (b) An applicant who has not been assigned a social security number  
 24 shall:

- 25 (i) Present written verification from the social security admin-  
 26 istration that the applicant has not been assigned a social secu-  
 27 rity number; and
- 28 (ii) Submit a birth certificate, passport or other documentary  
 29 evidence issued by an entity other than a state or the United  
 30 States; and
- 31 (iii) Submit such proof as the department may require that the ap-  
 32 plicant is lawfully present in the United States.

33 A driver's license, commercial learner's permit or any instruction  
 34 permit issued on and after January 1, 1993, shall not contain an appli-  
 35 cant's social security number. Applications on file shall be exempt  
 36 from disclosure except as provided in sections 49-202, 49-203, 49-203A  
 37 and 49-204, Idaho Code.

38 (c) Every application for a class A, B or C license shall state where the  
 39 applicant has been licensed for the preceding ten (10) years and under  
 40 which of the following driving categories the applicant will operate:

- 41 (i) Non-excepted Interstate. The applicant operates or expects  
 42 to operate in interstate commerce, and is required to provide a  
 43 medical examiner's certificate;
- 44 (ii) Excepted Interstate. The applicant operates or expects to  
 45 operate in interstate commerce, but engages exclusively in trans-  
 46 portation or operations excepted by the federal motor carrier  
 47 safety administration from all or parts of the qualification re-  
 48 quirements of federal motor carrier safety regulation 49, part  
 49 391, and is therefore not required to provide a medical examiner's  
 50 certificate;

1 (iii) Non-excepted Intrastate. The applicant operates only in  
2 intrastate commerce and is subject to and meets all Idaho driver  
3 qualification requirements and the applicable parts of federal  
4 motor carrier safety regulation 49, part 391, and is required to  
5 provide a medical examiner's certificate; or

6 (iv) Excepted Intrastate. The applicant operates in intrastate  
7 commerce, but engages exclusively in exempted transportation or  
8 operations as listed in section 67-2901B(2), Idaho Code, and the  
9 applicable parts of federal motor carrier safety regulation 49,  
10 part 391, and is therefore not required to provide a medical exam-  
11 iner's certificate.

12 All applications shall also state whether the applicant has previ-  
13 ously been licensed as a driver, and if so, when and by what state or  
14 country, and whether a driver's license or privileges have ever been  
15 suspended, revoked, denied, disqualified, canceled or whether an ap-  
16 plication has ever been refused, and if so, the date of and reason for  
17 the suspension, revocation, denial, disqualification, cancellation  
18 or refusal and the applicant's oath that all information is correct as  
19 signified by the applicant's signature.

20 (d) The applicant must submit proof of identity acceptable to the exam-  
21 iner or the department and date of birth as set forth in a certified copy  
22 of his birth certificate. When a certified copy of his birth certifi-  
23 cate or a delayed birth certificate is impossible to obtain from a vital  
24 statistics agency, another government issued document may be submitted  
25 that provides satisfactory evidence of a person's full legal name and  
26 date of birth acceptable to the examiner or the department.

27 (e) Every applicant for a class A, B or C driver's license or commer-  
28 cial learner's permit shall provide proof of United States citizenship  
29 or lawful permanent residency in the United States upon application for  
30 issuance, transfer, upgrade or renewal, unless the applicant's driving  
31 record already contains documentation confirming United States citi-  
32 zenship or lawful permanent residency. Every applicant for a nondomi-  
33 ciled class A, B or C driver's license or commercial learner's permit  
34 domiciled in a foreign country must provide an unexpired employment au-  
35 thorization document issued by the department of homeland security or  
36 an unexpired foreign passport accompanied by an approved I-94 form doc-  
37 umenting the applicant's most recent admittance into the United States.

38 (f) Individuals required to register in compliance with section 3 of  
39 the federal military selective service act, 50 U.S.C. App. 451 et seq.,  
40 as amended, shall be provided an opportunity to fulfill such registra-  
41 tion requirements in conjunction with an application for a driver's li-  
42 cense, commercial learner's permit or instruction permit. Any regis-  
43 tration information so supplied shall be transmitted by the department  
44 to the selective service system.

45 (3) Whenever an application is received from a person previously li-  
46 censed in another jurisdiction, the department shall request a copy of the  
47 driver's record from the other jurisdiction and shall contact the national  
48 driver register. When received, the driver's record from the previous ju-  
49 risdiction shall become a part of the driver's record in this state with the

1 same force and effect as though entered on the driver's record in this state  
2 in the original instance.

3 (4) Whenever the department receives a request for a driver's record  
4 from another licensing jurisdiction, the record shall be forwarded without  
5 charge.

6 (5) The department shall contact and notify the commercial driver li-  
7 cense information system of the proposed application for a class A, B or C  
8 driver's license or commercial learner's permit to ensure identification of  
9 the person and to obtain clearance to issue the license.

10 (6) When the fees required under this section are collected by a county  
11 officer, they shall be paid over to the county treasurer not less often than  
12 monthly, who shall immediately:

13 (a) Deposit an amount equal to five dollars (\$5.00) from each driver's  
14 license except an eight-year class D license, or any class D instruction  
15 permit application fees, application for a duplicate driver's license  
16 or permit, classification change, seasonal driver's license and addi-  
17 tional endorsement, and ten dollars (\$10.00) from each eight-year class  
18 D driver's license, in the current expense fund; and

19 (b) Deposit two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) from each motorcycle  
20 endorsement and motorcycle endorsement instruction permit fee in the  
21 current expense fund; and

22 (c) Deposit an amount equal to three dollars (\$3.00) from each fee for a  
23 knowledge test in the current expense fund; and

24 (d) Deposit an amount equal up to ten twenty-five dollars (~~\$10~~25.00)  
25 from each fee for a motorcycle endorsement skills test in the current  
26 expense fund; provided however, if a contractor administers the skills  
27 test he shall be entitled to the ten dollar (~~\$10.00~~) entire fee; and

28 (e) Remit the remainder to the state treasurer; and

29 (f) Deposit ~~seventeen~~ up to twenty-eight dollars and fifty cents  
30 (~~\$17~~28.50) from each fee for a class D skills test into the county cur-  
31 rent expense fund, unless the test is administered by a department-ap-  
32 proved contractor, in which case the contractor shall be entitled to  
33 ~~seventeen~~ up to twenty-eight dollars and fifty cents (~~\$17~~28.50) of each  
34 fee.

35 (7) When the fees required under this section are collected by a state  
36 officer or agency, they shall be paid over to the state treasurer.

37 (8) The state treasurer shall distribute the moneys received from fees  
38 imposed by the provisions of this section, whether collected by a county of-  
39 ficer or by a state officer or agency as follows:

40 (a) Two dollars (\$2.00) of each fee for a four-year driver's license  
41 or seasonal driver's license, and four dollars (\$4.00) of each fee for  
42 an eight-year class D driver's license, and one dollar and fifty cents  
43 (\$1.50) of each fee charged for driver's licenses pursuant to subsec-  
44 tions (1) (b), (d) and (e) of this section, and fifty cents (50¢) of each  
45 fee charged for driver's licenses pursuant to subsections (1) (c) and  
46 (f) of this section, shall be deposited in the emergency medical ser-  
47 vices fund II created in section 56-1018A, Idaho Code, and four dollars  
48 (\$4.00) of each fee charged pursuant to subsections (1) (a), (g) and (s)  
49 of this section and eight dollars (\$8.00) of each fee charged pursuant  
50 to subsection (1) (h) of this section and three dollars (\$3.00) of each

1 fee for driver's licenses pursuant to subsections (1) (b), (d) and (e)  
2 of this section, and one dollar (\$1.00) of each fee charged for driver's  
3 licenses pursuant to subsections (1) (c) and (f) of this section shall be  
4 deposited in the emergency medical services fund III created in section  
5 56-1018B, Idaho Code; and

6 (b) Twenty-eight dollars (\$28.00) of each fee for a seasonal or class A,  
7 B or C driver's license, and nineteen dollars and fifty cents (\$19.50)  
8 of each fee charged for a license pursuant to subsection (1) (b) of this  
9 section, and eight dollars and sixteen cents (\$8.16) of each fee charged  
10 for a license pursuant to subsection (1) (c) of this section shall be de-  
11 posited in the state highway account; and

12 (c) Twenty dollars (\$20.00) of each fee for a commercial learner's per-  
13 mit or driver's license classification change shall be deposited in the  
14 state highway account; and

15 (d) Four dollars (\$4.00) of each fee for a commercial learner's permit  
16 shall be deposited in the emergency medical services fund III created in  
17 section 56-1018B, Idaho Code; and

18 (e) Ten dollars (\$10.00) of each fee for a duplicate seasonal or class  
19 A, B or C driver's license, class A, B or C driver's license extension,  
20 or additional endorsement shall be deposited in the state highway ac-  
21 count; and

22 (f) Seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) of each fee for a motorcycle  
23 endorsement and motorcycle endorsement instruction permit shall be de-  
24 posited in the state highway account; and

25 (g) Five dollars and thirty cents (\$5.30) of each fee for a four-year  
26 class D driver's license, and ten dollars and sixty cents (\$10.60) of  
27 each fee for an eight-year class D driver's license, and four dollars  
28 (\$4.00) of each fee charged for a license pursuant to subsections (1) (d)  
29 and (e) of this section, and one dollar and thirty-three cents (\$1.33)  
30 of each fee charged for a license pursuant to subsection (1) (f) of this  
31 section shall be deposited in the driver training fund; and

32 (h) Twelve dollars and seventy cents (\$12.70) of each fee for a  
33 four-year class D driver's license, and twenty dollars and forty cents  
34 (\$20.40) of each fee for an eight-year class D driver's license, and ten  
35 dollars and fifty cents (\$10.50) of each fee charged for a license pur-  
36 suant to subsections (1)(d) and (e) of this section, and six dollars and  
37 eighty-three cents (\$6.83) of each fee charged for a license pursuant  
38 to subsection (1) (f) of this section shall be deposited in the highway  
39 distribution fund; and

40 (i) Two dollars and sixty cents (\$2.60) of each fee for a class D in-  
41 struction permit, duplicate class D license or permit, and class D li-  
42 cense extension shall be deposited in the driver training fund; and

43 (j) Seven dollars and forty cents (\$7.40) of each fee for a class D  
44 instruction permit, duplicate class D license or permit, and class D  
45 license extension shall be deposited in the highway distribution fund;  
46 and

47 (k) Ten dollars (\$10.00) of each fee for a class A, B or C skills test  
48 shall be deposited in the state highway account; and

49 (l) One dollar (\$1.00) of each fee for a class A, B, C or four-year D  
50 driver's license, and two dollars (\$2.00) of each fee for an eight-year

1 class D driver's license, and one dollar (\$1.00) of each fee charged for  
 2 a license pursuant to subsections (1) (b), (d) and (e) of this section,  
 3 and thirty-four cents (34¢) of each fee charged for a license pursuant  
 4 to subsections (1) (c) and (f) of this section shall be deposited in the  
 5 motorcycle safety program fund established in section 33-4904, Idaho  
 6 Code; and

7 (m) Six dollars and fifty cents (\$6.50) of each fee for a class D skills  
 8 test shall be deposited into the state highway account.

9 (9) The contractor administering a class A, B or C skills test shall be  
 10 entitled to not more than one hundred ninety dollars (\$190) of the skills  
 11 test fee. A contractor administering a class A, B or C skills test may col-  
 12 lect an additional fee for the use of the contractor's vehicle for the skills  
 13 test.

14 (10) Sixty dollars (\$60.00) of each restricted driving permit and each  
 15 restricted school attendance driving permit shall be deposited in the state  
 16 highway account.

17 (11) The department may issue seasonal class B or C driver's licenses to  
 18 drivers who are employees of agri-chemical businesses, custom harvesters,  
 19 farm retail outlets and suppliers, and livestock feeders that:

20 (a) Will only be valid for driving commercial vehicles that normally  
 21 require class B or C commercial driver's licenses;

22 (b) Will be valid for seasonal periods that begin on the date of is-  
 23 suance and that are not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) days in a  
 24 twelve (12) month period;

25 (c) May only be obtained twice in a driver's lifetime;

26 (d) Are valid only within a one hundred fifty (150) mile radius of the  
 27 place of business or farm being serviced; and

28 (e) Will be valid only in conjunction with valid Idaho class D driver's  
 29 licenses.

30 (12) The department may issue seasonal class B or C driver's licenses to  
 31 drivers who:

32 (a) Have not violated the single license provisions of applicable fed-  
 33 eral regulations;

34 (b) Have not had any license suspensions, revocations or cancella-  
 35 tions;

36 (c) Have not had any convictions in any vehicle for any offense listed  
 37 in section 49-335(1) or (2), Idaho Code, or any one (1) serious traffic  
 38 offense;

39 (d) Have at least one (1) year of driving experience with a class D or  
 40 equivalent license in any type motor vehicle; and

41 (e) Are at least sixteen (16) years old.

42 SECTION 2. That Section 49-306, Idaho Code, as amended by Section 2,  
 43 Chapter 216, Laws of 2017, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as fol-  
 44 lows:

20 domiciled in a foreign country must provide an unexpired employment au-  
21 thorization document issued by the department of homeland security or  
22 an unexpired foreign passport accompanied by an approved I-94 form doc-  
23 umenting the applicant's most recent admittance into the United States.

24 (f) Individuals required to register in compliance with section 3 of  
25 the federal military selective service act, 50 U.S.C. App. 451 et seq.,  
26 as amended, shall be provided an opportunity to fulfill such registra-  
27 tion requirements in conjunction with an application for a driver's li-  
28 cense, commercial learner's permit or instruction permit. Any regis-  
29 tration information so supplied shall be transmitted by the department  
30 to the selective service system.

31 (4) Whenever an application is received from a person previously li-  
32 censed in another jurisdiction, the department shall request a copy of the  
33 driver's record from the other jurisdiction and shall contact the national  
34 driver register. When received, the driver's record from the previous ju-  
35 risdiction shall become a part of the driver's record in this state with the  
36 same force and effect as though entered on the driver's record in this state  
37 in the original instance.

38 (5) Whenever the department receives a request for a driver's record  
39 from another licensing jurisdiction, the record shall be forwarded without  
40 charge.

41 (6) The department shall contact and notify the commercial driver li-  
42 cense information system of the proposed application for a class A, B or C  
43 driver's license or commercial learner's permit to ensure identification of  
44 the person and to obtain clearance to issue the license.

45 (7) When the fees required under this section are collected by a county  
46 officer, they shall be paid over to the county treasurer not less often than  
47 monthly, who shall immediately:

48 (a) Deposit an amount equal to five dollars (\$5.00) from each driver's  
49 license except an eight-year class D license, or any class D instruction  
50 permit application fees, application for a duplicate driver's license

1 or permit, classification change, seasonal driver's license and addi-  
2 tional endorsement, and ten dollars (\$10.00) from each eight-year class  
3 D driver's license, in the current expense fund;

4 (b) Deposit two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) from each motorcycle  
5 endorsement and motorcycle endorsement instruction permit fee in the  
6 current expense fund;

7 (c) Deposit an amount equal to three dollars (\$3.00) from each fee for a  
8 knowledge test in the current expense fund;

9 (d) Deposit an amount equal up to ten twenty-five dollars (~~\$10~~25.00)  
10 from each fee for a motorcycle endorsement skills test in the current  
11 expense fund; provided however, if a contractor administers the skills  
12 test he shall be entitled to the ~~ten-dollar (\$10.00)~~ entire fee;

13 (e) Remit the remainder to the state treasurer; and

14 (f) Deposit ~~seventeen up to twenty-eight~~ dollars and fifty cents  
15 (~~\$17~~28.50) from each fee for a class D skills test into the county cur-  
16 rent expense fund, unless the test is administered by a department-ap-  
17 proved contractor, in which case the contractor shall be entitled to  
18 ~~seventeen up to twenty-eight~~ dollars and fifty cents (~~\$17~~28.50) of each  
19 fee.

20 (8) When the fees required under this section are collected by a state  
21 officer or agency, they shall be paid over to the state treasurer.

22 (9) The state treasurer shall distribute the moneys received from fees  
23 imposed by the provisions of this section, whether collected by a county of-  
24 ficer or by a state officer or agency as follows:

25 (a) Two dollars (\$2.00) of each fee for a four-year driver's license  
26 or seasonal driver's license, and four dollars (\$4.00) of each fee for  
27 an eight-year class D driver's license, and one dollar and fifty cents  
28 (\$1.50) of each fee charged for driver's licenses pursuant to subsec-  
29 tion (1) (b), (d) and (e) of this section, and fifty cents (50¢) of each  
30 fee charged for driver's licenses pursuant to subsection (1) (c) and  
31 (f) of this section, shall be deposited in the emergency medical ser-  
32 vices fund II created in section 56-1018A, Idaho Code, and four dollars  
33 (\$4.00) of each fee charged pursuant to subsection (1) (a), (g) and (s)  
34 of this section and eight dollars (\$8.00) of each fee charged pursuant  
35 to subsection (1) (h) of this section and three dollars (\$3.00) of each  
36 fee for driver's licenses pursuant to subsection (1) (b), (d) and (e) of  
37 this section, and one dollar (\$1.00) of each fee charged for driver's  
38 licenses pursuant to subsection (1) (c) and (f) of this section shall be  
39 deposited in the emergency medical services fund III created in section  
40 56-1018B, Idaho Code;

41 (b) Twenty-eight dollars (\$28.00) of each fee for a seasonal or class A,  
42 B or C driver's license, and nineteen dollars and fifty cents (\$19.50)  
43 of each fee charged for a license pursuant to subsection (1) (b) of this  
44 section, and eight dollars and sixteen cents (\$8.16) of each fee charged  
45 for a license pursuant to subsection (1) (c) of this section shall be de-  
46 posited in the state highway account;

47 (c) Twenty dollars (\$20.00) of each fee for a commercial learner's per-  
48 mit or driver's license classification change shall be deposited in the  
49 state highway account;

1 (d) Four dollars (\$4.00) of each fee for a commercial learner's permit  
2 shall be deposited in the emergency medical services fund III created in  
3 section 56-1018B, Idaho Code;

4 (e) Ten dollars (\$10.00) of each fee for a duplicate seasonal or class  
5 A, B or C driver's license, class A, B or C driver's license extension,  
6 or additional endorsement shall be deposited in the state highway ac-  
7 count;

8 (f) Seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) of each fee for a motorcycle  
9 endorsement and motorcycle endorsement instruction permit shall be de-  
10 posited in the state highway account;

11 (g) Five dollars and thirty cents (\$5.30) of each fee for a four-year  
12 class D driver's license, and ten dollars and sixty cents (\$10.60) of  
13 each fee for an eight-year class D driver's license, and four dollars  
14 (\$4.00) of each fee charged for a license pursuant to subsection (1) (d)  
15 and (e) of this section, and one dollar and thirty-three cents (\$1.33)  
16 of each fee charged for a license pursuant to subsection (1) (f) of this  
17 section shall be deposited in the driver training fund;

18 (h) Twelve dollars and seventy cents (\$12.70) of each fee for a  
19 four-year class D driver's license, and twenty dollars and forty cents  
20 (\$20.40) of each fee for an eight-year class D driver's license, and ten  
21 dollars and fifty cents (\$10.50) of each fee charged for a license pur-  
22 suant to subsection (1) (d) and (e) of this section, and six dollars and  
23 eighty-three cents (\$6.83) of each fee charged for a license pursuant  
24 to subsection (1) (f) of this section shall be deposited in the highway  
25 distribution fund;

26 (i) Two dollars and sixty cents (\$2.60) of each fee for a class D in-  
27 struction permit, duplicate class D license or permit, and class D li-  
28 cense extension shall be deposited in the driver training fund;

29 (j) Seven dollars and forty cents (\$7.40) of each fee for a class D in-  
30 struction permit, duplicate class D license or permit, and class D li-  
31 cense extension shall be deposited in the highway distribution fund;

32 (k) Ten dollars (\$10.00) of each fee for a class A, B or C skills test  
33 shall be deposited in the state highway account;

34 (l) One dollar (\$1.00) of each fee for a class A, B, C or four-year D  
35 driver's license, and two dollars (\$2.00) of each fee for an eight-year  
36 class D driver's license, and one dollar (\$1.00) of each fee charged for  
37 a license pursuant to subsection (1) (b), (d) and (e) of this section,  
38 and thirty-four cents (34¢) of each fee charged for a license pursuant  
39 to subsection (1) (c) and (f) of this section shall be deposited in the  
40 motorcycle safety program fund established in section 33-4904, Idaho  
41 Code;

42 (m) Six dollars and fifty cents (\$6.50) of each fee for a class D skills  
43 test shall be deposited into the state highway account; and

44 (n) Each voluntary contribution of two dollars (\$2.00) as described in  
45 subsection (2) of this section, less actual administrative costs asso-  
46 ciated with collecting and transferring such contributions, shall be  
47 deposited into the organ donation contribution fund created in section  
48 49-2447, Idaho Code.

49 (10) The contractor administering a class A, B or C skills test shall  
50 be entitled to not more than one hundred ninety dollars (\$190) of the skills

1 test fee. A contractor administering a class A, B or C skills test may col-  
2 lect an additional fee for the use of the contractor's vehicle for the skills  
3 test.

4 (11) Sixty dollars (\$60.00) of each restricted driving permit and each  
5 restricted school attendance driving permit shall be deposited in the state  
6 highway account.

7 (12) The department may issue seasonal class B or C driver's licenses to  
8 drivers who are employees of agri-chemical businesses, custom harvesters,  
9 farm retail outlets and suppliers, and livestock feeders that:

10 (a) Will only be valid for driving commercial vehicles that normally  
11 require class B or C commercial driver's licenses;

12 (b) Will be valid for seasonal periods that begin on the date of is-  
13 suance and that are not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) days in a  
14 twelve (12) month period;

15 (c) May only be obtained twice in a driver's lifetime;

16 (d) Are valid only within a one hundred fifty (150) mile radius of the  
17 place of business or farm being serviced; and

18 (e) Will be valid only in conjunction with valid Idaho class D driver's  
19 licenses.

20 (13) The department may issue seasonal class B or C driver's licenses to  
21 drivers who:

22 (a) Have not violated the single license provisions of applicable fed-  
23 eral regulations;

24 (b) Have not had any license suspensions, revocations or cancella-  
25 tions;

26 (c) Have not had any convictions in any vehicle for any offense listed  
27 in section 49-335(1) or (2), Idaho Code, or any one (1) serious traffic  
28 offense;

29 (d) Have at least one (1) year of driving experience with a class D or  
30 equivalent license in any type motor vehicle; and

31 (e) Are at least sixteen (16) years old.

32 SECTION 3. Section 2 of this act shall be in full force and effect when  
33 the Idaho Transportation Department submits to the Secretary of State in  
34 writing that the Idaho Transportation Department's information technology  
35 system has been updated to support the Organ Donation Contribution Fund.
