1 2 3	AN ACT RELATING TO EDUCATION; AMENDING SECTION 33-1632, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE PRO- VISIONS REGARDING MASTERY-BASED EDUCATION.
4	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:
5 6	SECTION 1. That Section 33-1632, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:
7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20	33-1632. MASTERY-BASED EDUCATION. (1) The legislature finds that moving toward developing a mastery-based model of approach to education where students progress as they demonstrate mastery of a subject or grade level is in the best interest of Idaho students. The legislature further finds that moving from the current time-based system with a mastery-based model approach will allow for more personalized and differentiated learning; create a focus on explicit, measurable, transferable learning objectives that empower students; and emphasize competencies that include application and knowledge along with skill development. (2) The state board of education shall appoint a mastery-based education advisory commission. The commission will provide recommendations to the state board of education on policy changes that will allow implementation of a mastery-based approach to education in Idaho. The commission's membership shall not exceed twelve (12) members and shall include:

32 33	(vi) The Idaho education technology association.(3) The Idaho mastery education network shall be composed of Idaho pub-
34	lic school districts and charter schools that shall collaborate to transi-
35	tion Idaho to a mastery-based approach to education. The network shall:

- (b) Develop evidence-based recommendations for continued implementation; and
- (c) Provide network-wide resources, including professional development, coaching and best practices.

<u>(4)</u> The state department of education shall perform the following activities to move Idaho toward establish a mastery-based approach to education system in Idaho:

- (a) Conduct a <u>an ongoing</u> statewide awareness campaign to promote understanding and interest in mastery-based education for teachers, administrators, parents, students, business leaders and policymakers;
- (b) Establish a committee of educators to identify roadblocks and possible solutions in implementing mastery-based education and develop recommendations for the incubator process; and Maintain the Idaho mastery education network pursuant to subsection (3) of this section;
- (c) Facilitate the planning and development of an incubator process and assessments of local education agencies to identify the initial cohort of up to twenty (20) local education agencies to serve as incubators in fiscal year 2017 Distribute funds directly to public school districts and charter schools that are participating in the network and that have applied for and been approved to receive these funds. The funds will be used for curriculum, local systems of assessment, educator mentoring and coaching, planning activities, professional development and training, stakeholder engagement, and technology to enable personalized, mastery-based approaches; and
- (d) Create a sustainability plan for statewide scaling of Idaho's mastery-based education system and ensure that all public school districts and charter schools participating in the Idaho mastery education network develop plans within five (5) years of entry into the network that describe how the public school district or charter school will maintain a mastery-based approach to education. District plans must include a process for students in the mastery subjects or grades to advance to subsequent grades in accordance with their demonstrated mastery level until graduation from high school.
- (35) The state department of education may expend or distribute moneys appropriated for purposes identified in subsection (24) of this section. The cost of activities provided for in this section shall be paid by the state department of education from moneys appropriated for this program in the educational support program budget as provided for in section 33-1002, Idaho Code.
- (6) At any time, public school districts and charter schools may implement a mastery-based approach to education in the district or charter school, a school within the public school district, or in specific grade levels, content areas, or both, within a school or combination of schools. If the public school district or charter school intends to participate in the Idaho mastery education network in order to benefit from network-wide resources, the local school board shall notify the state department of education. The notification shall include the schools, content areas or grade levels that are being transitioned to a mastery-based approach.
- (7) Public school districts and charter schools notifying the state department of education pursuant to subsection (6) of this section are not entitled to mastery-based education funds distributed directly to public school districts and charter schools pursuant to subsection (4) (c) of this section.

- (48) Not No later than January 31 of each year, the state department of education shall report annually to the state board of education and the education committees of the senate and the house of representatives regarding the progress toward implementing mastery-based education.
 - (59) For purposes of this section:

- (a) "Incubator process" means a process where districts and charter schools that are willing and ready to start moving toward a mastery-based education system would be identified through site assessments and would form an initial cohort of incubators for mastery-based education. The incubators would receive support for staff professional development, stakeholder education and ongoing assessment and coaching. These incubators would provide data and best practices for continued implementation of mastery-based education.
- (b) "Mastery-based approach to education system" means an education system where student progress is based upon on a student's demonstration of mastery of competencies and content, not seat time or the age or grade level of the student.
- (b) "Network" means the Idaho mastery education network.
