HOUSE BILL NO. 612

AN ACT

1 RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING; AMENDING CHAPTER 35, TITLE
2 67, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 67-3532, IDAHO CODE, TO
3 ESTABLISH THE TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE STABILIZATION FUND; AND PRO-
4 VIDING FOR AN APPROPRIATION AND A TRANSFER OF FUNDS TO THE TECHNOLOGY
5 INFRASTRUCTURE STABILIZATION FUND.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

8 SECTION 1. That Chapter 35, Title 67, Idaho Code, be, and the same is
9 hereby amended by the addition thereto of a NEW SECTION, to be known and des-
10 ignated as Section 67-3532, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

11 67-3532. TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE STABILIZATION FUND. (1) There is
12 hereby created in the state treasury the technology infrastructure stabi-
13 lization fund. The fund shall consist of moneys that may be provided by leg-
14 islative appropriation. The state treasurer shall invest the idle moneys of
15 the fund, and the interest earned on such investments shall be retained by
16 the fund.

17 (2) Subject to appropriation by the legislature, moneys in the technol-
18 ogy infrastructure stabilization fund shall be used solely for:

19 (a) Technology projects requested, recommended, or funded through the
20 annual state budget process pursuant to this chapter including, but not
21 limited to, software development and computer hardware or equipment;
22 and

23 (b) The legislative services office to evaluate and provide analysis
24 and recommendations regarding the requirements, merit, necessity,
25 cost, compatibility, and monitoring of technology projects that may
26 be requested, recommended, or funded through the annual state budget
27 process pursuant to this chapter, as well as other state technology
28 projects, needs, or issues.

29 SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated and the State Controller shall
30 transfer \$22,000,000 from the General Fund to the Technology Infrastructure
31 Stabilization Fund on July 1, 2018, or as soon thereafter as practicable, for
32 the period July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019.
