HOUSE BILL NO. 798

BY APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE

AN ACT

RELATING TO SALARY-BASED APPORTIONMENT AND CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY; AMENDING SECTION 33-1004E, IDAHO CODE, TO INCREASE THE BASE SALARY FOR ADMINISTRATORS AND FOR CLASSIFIED STAFF; CLARIFYING USES FOR CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY FUNDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Section 33-1004E, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

33-1004E. DISTRICT'S SALARY-BASED APPORTIONMENT. Each district shall be entitled to a salary-based apportionment calculated as provided in this section.

(1) To determine the apportionment for instructional staff, take the amounts indicated on the career ladder table plus the amounts associated with the additional education allocation amounts pursuant to section 33-1004B, Idaho Code, and calculate the weighted average. The amount so determined shall be multiplied by the district staff allowance for instructional staff determined as provided in section 33-1004(2), Idaho Code. Full-time instructional staff salaries shall be determined from a salary schedule developed by each district and submitted to the state department of education. No full-time instructional staff member or pupil service staff member on the residency compensation rung shall be paid less than the minimum dollar amount on the career ladder residency compensation rung pursuant to section 33-1004B, Idaho Code, for the applicable fiscal year.

(2) Effective July 1, 2022, no full-time instructional staff member or pupil service staff member on the professional or advanced professional compensation rung shall be paid less than the minimum dollar amount on the career ladder professional compensation rung pursuant to section 33-1004B, Idaho Code, for the applicable fiscal year.

(3) Effective July 1, 2025, no full-time instructional staff member or pupil service staff member on the advanced professional compensation rung shall be paid less than the minimum dollar amount on the advanced professional compensation rung pursuant to section 33-1004B, Idaho Code, for the applicable fiscal year.

(4) If an instructional staff member has been certified by the national board for professional teaching standards, the staff member shall receive two thousand dollars (\$2,000) per year for five (5) years from the year in which national board certification was earned. The district staff allotment shall be increased by two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for each national board-certified instructional staff member who earned national board certification; provided however, that no such awards shall be paid for the period July 1, 2010, through June 30, 2011, nor shall any liabilities accrue or payments be made pursuant to this section in the future to any individu-

1 als who would have otherwise qualified for a payment during this stated time
 2 period. The resulting amount is the district's salary-based apportionment
 3 for instructional staff. For purposes of this section, teachers qualifying
 4 for the salary increase shall be those who have been recognized as national
 5 board-certified teachers as of July 1 of each year.

6 (5) To determine the apportionment for pupil service staff, take
 7 the amounts indicated on the career ladder table plus the amounts associ-
 8 ated with the additional education allocation amounts pursuant to section
 9 33-1004B, Idaho Code, and calculate the weighted average. If the district
 10 does not employ any pupil service staff, the district's pupil service staff
 11 average salary shall equal the district's instructional staff average
 12 salary for purposes of calculating pupil service salary-based apportion-
 13 ment. The amount so determined shall be multiplied by the district staff al-
 14 lowance for pupil service staff determined pursuant to section 33-1004(3),
 15 Idaho Code. Full-time pupil service staff salaries shall be determined from
 16 a salary schedule developed by each district and submitted to the state de-
 17 partment of education. The resulting amount is the district's salary-based
 18 apportionment for pupil service staff. No full-time pupil service staff
 19 member shall be paid less than the minimum dollar amount on the career ladder
 20 residency compensation rung pursuant to section 33-1004B, Idaho Code, for
 21 the applicable fiscal year.

22 (6) To determine the apportionment for district administrative staff,
 23 first determine the district average experience and education index by plac-
 24 ing all eligible certificated administrative employees on the statewide
 25 index provided in section 33-1004A, Idaho Code. The resulting average is the
 26 district index. If the district does not employ any administrative staff,
 27 the district administrative index shall equal the statewide average index
 28 for purposes of calculating administrative salary-based apportionment. The
 29 On and after July 1, 2022, the district administrative staff index shall be
 30 multiplied by the base salary of ~~thirty-eight thousand seven hundred sev-~~
 31 ~~enty-seven dollars (\$38,777) forty-one thousand four hundred ninety-one~~
 32 dollars (\$41,491). The amount so determined shall be multiplied by the
 33 district staff allowance for administrative staff determined as provided
 34 in section 33-1004(4), Idaho Code. The resulting amount is the district's
 35 salary-based apportionment for administrative staff.

36 (7) ~~To~~ On and after July 1, 2022, to determine the apportionment
 37 for classified staff, multiply ~~twenty-three thousand two hundred sixteen~~
 38 ~~dollars (\$23,216)~~ twenty-four thousand eight hundred forty-one dollars
 39 (\$24,841) by the district classified staff allowance determined as provided
 40 in section 33-1004(5), Idaho Code. The amount so determined is the dis-
 41 trict's apportionment for classified staff.

42 (8) The district's salary-based apportionment shall be the sum of the
 43 apportionments calculated in subsections (1), (4), (5), (6) and (7) of this
 44 section, plus the benefit apportionment as provided in section 33-1004F,
 45 Idaho Code.

46 SECTION 2. CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY. Notwithstanding the provisions of
 47 Section 7 of House Bill 797, as enacted by the Second Regular Session of the
 48 Sixty-sixth Idaho Legislature, and any other provision of law to the con-
 49 trary, of the moneys appropriated in Section 1 of said bill, \$26,500,000 from
 50 the Public School Income Fund shall be distributed for classroom technology,

1 classroom technology infrastructure, wireless technology infrastructure,
2 and learning management systems that assist teachers and students in effec-
3 tive and efficient instruction or learning. Funding shall be distributed
4 based on a formula prescribed by the State Department of Education. Moneys
5 so distributed shall be used to implement and operate a learning management
6 system of each school district's or public charter school's choice. A learn-
7 ing management system shall include integration with a school district's or
8 public charter school's Student Information System (SIS) and shall admin-
9 ister, monitor, and document student and classroom levels of learning. The
10 State Department of Education shall verify that school districts and public
11 charter schools are using funds to purchase a learning management system
12 that is compliant with these standards.

13 SECTION 3. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby
14 declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its
15 passage and approval.
