1 RELATING TO LICENSE PLATES; AMENDING SECTION 49-403A, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE
2 FEE EXEMPTIONS FOR CERTAIN PURPLE HEART RECIPIENTS AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL
3 CORRECTIONS.

5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

6 SECTION 1. That Section 49-403A, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
7 amended to read as follows:

8 49-403A. PURPLE HEART RECIPIENT -- LICENSE PLATES. (1) Purple heart
9 recipient license plates are available to any applicant who is a veteran or
10 an active or retired member of any of the armed forces of the United States,
11 reserve forces or Idaho national guard, and who furnishes proof of entitle-
12 ment by providing one (1) of the following documents:

13 (a) A copy of form DD214 or equivalent document showing an award of the
14 purple heart medal;

15 (b) A copy of the certificate presented with the medal; or

16 (c) A copy of the military order describing the award of the medal to the
17 applicant.

18 (2) In addition to the regular registration fee, the applicant shall be
19 charged the plate fee required in section 49-450, Idaho Code. Whenever title
20 or interest in a vehicle registered under the provisions of this section is
21 transferred or assigned, the registration shall expire, but the purple heart
22 recipient may transfer his plates to another vehicle upon payment of the re-
23 quired transfer fees. He may ~~only~~ display the plates only after receipt of
24 new registration from the department. A purple heart recipient shall not
25 register more than two (2) vehicles under the provisions of this section.
26 The provisions of this section shall not apply to any vehicle with a regis-
27 tered maximum gross weight over twenty-six thousand (26,000) pounds, nor to
28 any vehicle registered under section 49-434(5), Idaho Code.

29 (3) Purple heart recipient license plates may be retained and displayed
30 on vehicles owned by the surviving spouse of a deceased purple heart recipi-
31 ent. In addition, the surviving spouse of a deceased purple heart recipient
32 is eligible to reapply for and shall be issued purple heart recipient license
33 plates if the deceased purple heart recipient died on or after January 1 of
34 the five (5) years preceding the date of reapplication for the plates. Such
35 plates shall be used on a vehicle owned by the surviving spouse.

36 (4) The purple heart recipient license plates shall be of a color and
37 design acceptable to the military order of the purple heart association and
38 approved by the department, utilizing a numbering system as determined by
39 the department.

40 (5) Effective January 1, 2015, for those purple heart recipients who
41 are listed as an owner of the vehicle who also qualify as disabled pursuant
42 to section 49-410, Idaho Code, the international accessible symbol will also

1 appear on the purple heart license plates. Such requirements must be met
2 upon application for the license plates. Those plates with the disability
3 symbol shall be nontransferable to a surviving spouse, unless the require-
4 ments of section 49-410, Idaho Code, can be met by the spouse.

5 (6) A purple heart recipient who qualifies for a disabled veteran fee
6 exemption under section 49-403, Idaho Code, shall have a choice between a
7 purple heart recipient license plate or a disabled veteran license plate and
8 shall not be charged a plate fee or a fee for registration or reregistration
9 of the motor vehicle. The provisions of this subsection shall apply to the
10 vehicle originally purchased under this authorization and also to any ve-
11 hicle subsequently purchased and owned by the same veteran. The privilege
12 shall not extend to more than one (1) vehicle owned by the veteran at a time.
