Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 94, Title 67, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and designated as Section 67-9408, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

- 67-9408. TREATMENT OF APPRENTICESHIPS FOR LICENSING PURPOSES. (1) The purpose of this section is to allow individuals to work and earn a paycheck while also fulfilling licensing requirements and gaining the necessary skills to fill the needs of an expanding workforce.
- (2) As used in this section, the term "apprenticeship" means an on-thejob learning program in an occupation that:
 - (a) Involves skills that are customarily learned in a practical way through a structured, systematic program of on-the-job supervised learning;
 - (b) Requires skills that are clearly identified and commonly recognized throughout an industry;
 - (c) Involves the progressive attainment of manual, mechanical, or technical skills and knowledge that, in accordance with the industry standard for the occupation, would require the completion of at least two thousand (2,000) hours of on-the-job learning to attain; and
 - (d) Requires related instruction to supplement the on-the-job learning.
 - (3) A licensing authority shall grant a license to any applicant who:
 - (a) Completes an apprenticeship in the licensed occupation;
 - (b) Passes the relevant examination, if required by the licensing authority;
 - (c) Pays any fees required by the licensing authority; and
 - (d) Completes any related instruction required to supplement on-the-job learning.
- (4) A licensing authority shall use the same passing score for examinations of applicants under this chapter that are used for applicants under the standard licensing processes. If the relevant licensing authority or statute does not require an examination for the standard licensing process, no examination shall be required for applicants who obtain licensure through an apprenticeship.
- (5) A licensing authority shall use the same licensing fee for applicants under this chapter that are used for applicants under the standard licensing processes. If the relevant licensing authority does not require a

fee for the standard licensing process for an occupation, no fee shall be required for applicants who obtain licensure through an apprenticeship.

- (6) Apprenticeships for an occupation shall not be required to exceed the number of hours required by the relevant licensing authority or statute for that occupation.
- (7) Licensing authorities shall work with relevant agencies, including the state department of education, the workforce development council, and career technical education to ensure that apprenticeship opportunities are made available to secondary and postsecondary students.
