RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES FOR 2 FISCAL YEAR 2021; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER 3 RESOURCES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021; LIMITING THE NUMBER OF AUTHORIZED 4 FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS; APPROPRIATING AND TRANSFERRING MONEYS 5 FOR AQUIFER MONITORING; TRANSFERRING MONEYS FOR AQUIFER MANAGEMENT; 6 7 APPROPRIATING AND TRANSFERRING MONEYS FOR FLOOD MANAGEMENT; PROVID-ING REQUIREMENTS FOR WATER QUALITY MONITORING; AND APPROPRIATING AND 8 TRANSFERRING MONEYS FOR PRIEST LAKE USER FEES. 9

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

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SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Water Resources the following amounts to be expended according to the designated programs and expense classes from the listed funds for the period July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021:

SECTION 2. FTP AUTHORIZATION. In accordance with Section 67-3519,
Idaho Code, the Department of Water Resources is authorized no more than
one hundred fifty-one (151.00) full-time equivalent positions at any point
during the period July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, unless specifically

authorized by the Governor. The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee
will be notified promptly of any increased positions so authorized.

SECTION 3. CASH TRANSFER FOR AQUIFER MONITORING. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Water Resources and the State Controller shall transfer \$716,000 from the Revolving Development Fund to the Aquifer Planning and Management Fund on July 1, 2020, or as soon thereafter as practicable for the period July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, to be used for aquifer monitoring, measurement, and modeling.

9 SECTION 4. CASH TRANSFER FOR AQUIFER MANAGEMENT. Of the amount appropriated to the Department of Water Resources in Section 1 of this act for the Planning and Technical Services Program from the General Fund for lump sum, the State Controller shall transfer \$5,000,000 to the Secondary Aquifer Planning, Management, and Implementation Fund on July 1, 2020, or as soon thereafter as practicable for the period July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, to be used for aquifer recharge and management.

SECTION 5. CASH TRANSFER FOR THE FLOOD MANAGEMENT PROGRAM. There is 16 hereby appropriated and the State Controller shall transfer \$1,000,000 from 17 18 the General Fund to the Water Management Account created pursuant to Section 42-1760, Idaho Code, on July 1, 2020, or as soon thereafter as practica-19 ble for the period July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, for water quality 20 data collection, monitoring, modeling, flood-damaged stream channel re-21 22 pair, stream channel improvement, flood risk reduction, or flood prevention projects. Of these moneys, up to \$800,000 shall be administered by the Idaho 23 Water Resource Board through a competitive, matching grant process for flood 24 control projects. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 42-1760(2)(b), 25 Idaho Code, grants may be larger than \$50,000 at the discretion of the board. 26 27 The selection process for these grants shall require the availability of fifty percent (50%) matching funds, and flood prevention and mitigation 28 projects shall be given priority on a competitive statewide basis throughout 29 Idaho. The Department of Water Resources shall support this competitive 30 grant process using existing personnel and resources. 31

SECTION 6. WATER QUALITY MONITORING. Of the moneys appropriated and 32 transferred in Section 5 of this act for water quality data collection, up 33 to \$200,000 shall be used for monitoring, data collection, modeling, lit-34 erature review, economic analysis, and other forms of data gathering and 35 analysis in the upper Snake/Rock Creek subbasin (HUC 17040212, as provided 36 in IDAPA 58.01.02.109.02) in support of the nutrient total maximum daily 37 38 loads (TMDL) objectives. This process shall be coordinated with the Department of Environmental Quality and the United States Geological Survey. 39

SECTION 7. CASH TRANSFER FOR PRIEST LAKE USER FEES. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Water Resources and the State Controller shall transfer \$410,000 from the Miscellaneous Revenue Fund to the Revolving Development Fund on July 1, 2020, or as soon thereafter as practicable for the period July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, to be used for the operations and management of the Priest Lake Outlet Control Structure.

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
