SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 105

BY JUDICIARY AND RULES COMMITTEE

A SENATE RESOLUTION

1 STATING FINDINGS OF THE SENATE AND PROVIDING FOR THE AMENDMENT OF RULE 12 OF  
2 THE RULES OF THE SENATE TO PROVIDE FOR REFERRAL TO AN APPROPRIATE STAND-  
3 ING COMMITTEE AS DETERMINED BY THE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE OF THE SENATE.

5 Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Idaho:

6 WHEREAS, the Senate deems it necessary and desirable that Rule 12 of the  
7 Rules of the Senate be amended.

8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Senate, assembled  
9 in the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-fifth Idaho Legislature, that  
10 Rule 12 of the Rules of the Senate shall be amended to read as follows:

11 RULE 12

12 Petitions, Memorials, and Resolutions. -- (A) Senate petitions, memo-  
13 rials, and resolutions will be introduced at the Fifth Order of Business.  
14 Except for being introduced at the Fifth Order of Business, joint resolu-  
15 tions will be treated in all respects in a manner similar to bills. All other  
16 resolutions, and all petitions and memorials, shall be referred directly to  
17 the Judiciary and Rules Committee for printing upon their introduction; and  
18 after printing, all resolutions, petitions, and memorials, except personal  
19 resolutions introduced during the first twelve legislative days, shall be  
20 referred to the Tenth Order of Business and held for one legislative day  
21 before being acted upon. Personal resolutions introduced during the first  
22 twelve legislative days will be treated in all respects in a manner similar  
23 to bills.

24 House Concurrent Resolutions and Memorials. -- (B) House concurrent  
25 resolutions and memorials shall be introduced at the Eleventh Order of Busi-  
26 ness and then shall be referred by the President to an appropriate standing  
27 committee as determined by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate. Upon  
28 receiving the committee report, the resolution or memorial shall be placed  
29 at the Tenth Order of Business, and held for one legislative day.
