H 411:	<b>Rep. Addis</b> presented <b>H 411</b> . He said the purpose of this bill is to provide timely notification to lienholders when a vehicle has been towed from private or posted property, stored or impounded, and not recovered by the vehicle owner within seventy-two hours, excluding weekends and holidays. This legislation will enable the lienholder to work with the owner to resolve payment to recover the vehicle or to reclaim the vehicle directly.	
MOTION:	<b>Rep.</b> Harris made a motion to send <b>H 411</b> to the floor with a <b>DO PASS</b> recommendation. <b>Motion carried by voice vote</b> . <b>Rep. Addis</b> will sponsor the bill on the floor.	
H 410:	As stated by <b>Rep. Monks</b> , vehicle owners are required to purchase and display license plates on their vehicles. Currently, license plates must be replaced every seven years regardless of condition. This legislation adjusts the length of time a license plate is valid from seven years to ten years. Rep. Monks addressed questions about reflectivity, warranty and vendors. He also recognized <b>Rep. Gannon</b> for researching this issue several years ago.
