Chairman Mendive called the meeting to order at 1:31 p.m.

MOTION: Rep. Green made a motion to approve the minutes of January 22, 2020. Motion

carried by voice vote.

H 450: Rep. Wagoner introduced H 450 to the committee and explained the legislation

allows local jurisdictions to determine whether rezone and annexation applications should go thru a recommendation hearing with a planning and zoning commission or to advance straight to the governing body for a final decision. He stated legislation is meant to streamline the process and eliminate confusion for property owners affected by the request. Committee members commented with concern that the bill limited citizen participation by allowing annexations and rezones to go straight to city council thereby cutting Planning and Zoning out of the process and

shortening the process.

MOTION: Rep. Zollinger made a motion to send H 450 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation.

Jerry Mason, Association of Idaho Cities, spoke in opposition to the legislation.

Jason Boal, Idaho Chapter of the American Planners Association, stated his

organization opposed the legislation.

Discussion on the motion was held. Committee members expressed concern about

reducing opportunity for citizen involvement.

ROLL CALL VOTE ON MOTION: Reps. Berch and Green spoke in opposition to H 450 and requested a roll call vote on H 450. Motion failed by a vote of 3 AYE and 9 NAY. Voting in favor of the motion: Reps. Zollinger, Wagoner and Wisniewski. Voting in opposition to the motion: Reps. Mendive, Kingsley, Barbieri, Collins, Christensen, Remington,

Nechocea, Berch and Green.

H 489: Rep. Zollinger explained H 489 repeals Idaho Code Section 50-222 and adds

new simplified language into Section 50-222. The new code section provides protections for landowners by clarifying and changing procedures by which a city in the state of Idaho may annex privately owned property. The new sections require that land to be annexed is adjacent to or surrounded by the city, requires the city to notify each landowner of the intent to annex, requires the city to publish a written annexation plan and to provide for a public hearing, and required consent of at least two-thirds of the land owners by a written instrument executed by the landowner or the landowner's agent. The new codes section also provides for tax relief for landowners annexed into a city but not receiving city services and maintains the procedure for judicial review of annexation decisions.

Those testifying in opposition of the legislation were Jerry Mason, legal council for the Association of Idaho Cities; and Jason Boal, Idaho Chapter of the American Planners Association. Rep. Christensen made a motion to send H 489 to the floor with a DO PASS MOTION: recommendation. SUBSTITUTE Rep. Green made a substitute motion to HOLD H 489 in committee. MOTION: ROLL CALL Rep. Green requested a roll call vote on H 489. Substitute motion failed by a vote of 3 AYE and 9 NAY. Voting in favor of the substitute motion: VOTE ON SUBSTITUTE Reps. Nechocea, Berch and Green. Voting in opposition to the substitute MOTION: motion: Reps. Mendive, Kingsley, Barbieri, Collins, Zollinger, Christensen, Remington, Wagoner, and Wisniewski. ROLL CALL Roll call vote requested on original motion. Motion carried by a vote of 9 AYE VOTE ON and 3 NAY. Voting in favor of the original motion: Reps. Mendive, Kingslev. ORIGINAL Barbieri, Collins, Zollinger, Christensen, Remington, Wagoner, Wisniewski. MOTION: Voting in opposition to the original motion: Reps. Nechocea, Berch and Green. Rep. Zollinger will sponsor the bill on the floor.
