





#### LAND GRANT MISSION

TEACHING, RESEARCH & OUTREACH

- >200 Faculty (half located off-campus)
- >700 Staff
- 9 Research and Extension Centers
  - Access to over 14,000 acres
- UI Extension offices in 42/44 counties
  - 81 Educators, 49 Specialists
  - >265,000 face-to-face contacts in 2021 in a COVID dominated year
- 774 undergraduate students
- 174 graduate students
- 7 academic departments offering over 40 grad/undergrad programs








#### LAND GRANT MISSION

TEACHING, RESEARCH & OUTREACH

- In 2021, over 51,000 Idaho youth were involved with UI Extension 4-H Youth Development
  - **14,000 4-H club members**
- >\$1M in scholarships awarded
  - Most per student of any U of I college
  - Welcomed the 3<sup>rd</sup> cohort of Chobani Scholars
- Only institution in Idaho to prepare ag teachers
  - 97/115 districts have ag programs
  - 90% of Idaho ag teachers have a CALS degree
- Top college at U of I in research expenditures
  - 20% of sponsored project activity on campus
  - \$36 million in research funding in FY21





### CALS Enrollment Highlights 2020 to 2021

- Undergraduates: 700 → 774
- Graduate students:  $152 \rightarrow 174$

### Led All Colleges (CALS; Ul avg)

- New Students (31.6%; 16.3%)
- **Undergraduates**(10.6%; 0.4%)
- Total Students (11.3%; 4.7%)



# SEED POTATO GERMPLASM FACILITY MOSCOW



- This facility will triple seed potato production and create plantlets free from viruses and other diseases
- Maintain more than 300 cultivars in support of the tri-state potato agreement and nationwide breeding programs
- Opened in December 2021
- Grand opening March 28, 2022
- **\$5.6 million** project cost
  - \$1.25 million from Idaho PotatoCommission
  - \$3 million from state legislature
  - \$250,000 from Northwest Farm Credit Services
  - \$1.1 million from U of I CALS





### IDAHO CENTER FOR PLANT AND SOIL HEALTH



- Renovations to the Parma Research and Extension Center facilities including equipment and infrastructure to support research and Extension efforts
- Enhance recruitment/retention of best faculty, expand graduate student training and attract nationally competitive grant funding
- Serve all of Idaho agriculture
- Campaign launched in March 2019
- \$7 million project cost
  - \$1 million contribution by U of I CALS
  - \$3 million raised from industry to date
  - \$3 million from state legislature
- Presenting to the SBOE for construction approval in February 2022




## IdahoCAFE Center for Agriculture, Food and the Environment

The Idaho Center for Agriculture, Food and the Environment (CAFE) will be the country's largest and most advanced research center targeting the dairy and allied industries. The dairy will have a herd size of 2,000 animals and will be located in the heart of the state's dairy producing region. While research data generated at CAFE will have broad implications across the U.S., the semi-arid environment where most of Idaho's dairies are located will make CAFE's research indispensable in the water-constrained West.

Through applied **research**, **teaching** and **Extension**, CAFE will be a sustainable agriculture system focused on providing global solutions to ongoing issues facing agriculture, food, the environment and society now and for years to come.



## IdahoCAFE

Center for Agriculture, Food and the Environment

June 2020	\$400k investment from Anheuser-Busch Foundation to support agronomic research
	at the Demonstration Farm

- Aug. 2021 First grower field day held at the Demonstration Farm
- Nov. 2021 SBOE approves dairy construction (\$25.5 million)
- Feb. 2022 Discussion with the Idaho Department of Lands about investment from the sale of the Caldwell R&E Center property into CAFÉ
- March 2022 Final design of the Research Dairy completed
- April 2022 Bid for construction
- June 2022 Construction begins
- Oct. 2023 First cows milking at the Research Dairy



## FACULTY AND STAFF RETENTION ISSUES

- Over the past 12 months, CALS has lost 22 faculty and 53 staff positions for an overall turnover rate of 16%.
- The greatest impact is at our Research and Extension Centers and county offices.



# WIMU REGIONAL PROGRAM IN VETERINARY MEDICINE

Will the legislature consider convening a task force to examine a better path forward for WIMU:

- In its current form, is WIMU satisfying the needs of the livestock industry in Idaho?
- Can we increase the number of students entering the WIMU program from Idaho?
- In discussions with WSU, we are considering a 3+1 agreement (similar to what Montana has with WIMU) where 1<sup>st</sup> year students are taught on the Moscow campus.
