SENATE EDUCATION COMMITTEE

CONVENED: **Chairman Thayn** called the meeting of the Senate Education Committee (Committee) to order at 3:00 p.m.

PASSED THE GAVEL: Chairman Thayn passed the gavel to Vice Chairman Lent

MOTION: **Senator Cook** moved to reopen **Docket No. 08-0000-2100**. **Senator Crabtree** seconded the motion. The motion passed by **voice vote**.

DOCKET NO. 08-0000-2100 **Vice-Chairman** Lent explained that the motion to reject a section in **Docket No. 08-0000-2100** which will be removed from the rule. A student will still need the same number of math credits to graduate, just not in the senior year of High School.

MOTION: **Senator Cook** moved to reject a section of **Docket No. 08-0000-2100**, 08.02.03.105.01.d.ii. iii. iv. **Senator Thayn** seconded the motion. The motion passed by **voice vote**.

DISCUSSION: **Chairman Thayn** pointed out that this rule does not change the number of credits required for math to graduate. It is still up to local school districts if they want to require senior math class or not. He stated that the students would be better served if they took a harder math class junior year of high school. Lastly, the way that remediation is done in college has changed from where it was a few years ago.
