CONVENED: Chairman Martin called the meeting of the Senate Health and Welfare

Committee (Committee) to order at 3:00 p.m.

S 1330 OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING - Adds to existing law to provide for

the licensure and registration of certain naturopathic doctors and naturopaths. Senator Anthon introduced himself to the Committee. He relayed that this was a voluntary licensure bill for Naturopathic Medical Doctors (NMD). Senator Anthon stated the reason to be licensed included the need for malpractice insurance, in order to take insurance payments for patients, to practice in a health care facility, and if you were already a physician and wanted to provide naturopathic medicine, your original licensing board could have had issue because it was outside of the scope of your current licensure. He stated this bill was for those who were already licensed physicians and had a second degree in naturopathy allowing for a second licensure. Senator Anthon relayed the licensure would enable the creation of a state board, the ability to propagate rules, and regulation of practitioners. He stated there were a couple of changes to be made and would like to request the Committee send

S 1330 to the 14th order for amendment.

DISCUSSION: Senator Wintrow asked for clarification on 54-5906 scope of practice. Senator

Anthon confirmed that they were not giving a new ability for procedures. He stated whatever procedures the original licensure covered would be used for

the naturopathic license.

TESTIMONY: Dr. Diane Crumrine, President, Idaho Chapter - American Association of

Naturopathic Physicians introduced herself to the Committee. She stated her

approval with the pending amendments. (see Attachment 1)

DISCUSSION: Senator Wintrow asked for Dr. Crumrine to point out the changes she had

spoke about. **Dr. Crumrine** stated removal of Naturopathic Medical Doctor from the itemized list of providers on page 1 and the added subsection 6 on page 5.

TESTIMONY: Dr. Colby Inzer, Naturopath and President, American Naturopathic Association

(ANA) introduced himself to the Committee. He stated the ANA was fully supportive of the bill with the suggested amendments. **Dr. Hansen** voiced his support and appreciated the hard work from the NMD and the 2 naturopathic

association to get the bill completed.

VOTE: Senator Stennett moved to send S 1330 to the 14th order for amendment.

Senator Lee seconded the motion. The motion carried by **voice vote**.

GUBERNATORIAL B.J. Stinger - Idaho Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired. Chairman Martin asked the Committee if there were any objections to APPOINTMENT VOTE: approving the gubernatorial reappointment. There were none. VOTE: Vice Chairman Riggs moved to send the Gubernatorial Reappointment of B.J. Stinger to the Idaho Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired to the floor with the recommendation he be confirmed by the Senate. Senator Wintrow seconded the motion. The motion carried by voice vote. **MINUTES** Senator Heider moved to approve the Minutes of January 17, 2022. Senator APPROVAL: **Stennett** seconded the motion.
