Chairman Palmer called the meeting to order at 1:31 p.m.

**Chairman Palmer** introduced committee Page **Alex Bude**`, son of **Nathan** and **Maggie Bude**`. Alex, a Senior at Timberline High School, is sponsored by **Rep.** 

Rubel.

**MOTION:** Rep. Manwaring made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 14, 16,

and 18, 2022, meetings. Motion carried by voice vote.

**H 573:** Rep. Adams said the purpose of this bill is to provide a more timely method for

disposal of abandoned and unclaimed low value vehicles. The current valuation for abandoned vehicle lien sale requirements does not reflect the market environment

law enforcement agencies and tow companies find themselves in. This bill increases the value below which a vehicle is considered low-valued.

Speaking in support were Randy Colson, Rocky Mountain Towing and Rick

Burlingame, Boise Valley Towing.

MOTION: Rep. McCrostie made a motion to send H 573 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation.

Committee members expressed concern with who does the appraisals and vehicle

assessments.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION:

Rep. Blanksma made a substitute motion to HOLD H 573 in committee.

**Rep. Gannon** spoke **in support** of the substitute motion.

VOTE ON SUBSTITUTE MOTION:

Chairman Palmer called for a vote on the substitute motion. Motion carried by

voice vote. Rep. McCrostie requested he be recorded as voting NAY.

S 1267: Senator Woodward said S 1267 provides an exemption from stopping and

inspection of noncommercial vehicles at check stations (ports of entry, weigh stations, and temporary check stations). These changes will reflect actual practice.

MOTION: Rep. Dixon made a motion to send S 1267 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Dixon will sponsor the bill

on the floor.

H 640: In her presentation, Rep. Green told the committee this legislation creates a policy that includes the following: When the Idaho Department of Transportation does a highway project, it shall consider whether it would be appropriate to include the installation of broadband infrastructure during the construction. She added, the policy creates efficiency, minimizes the number of times a road is opened up and allows broadband providers the use of state rights-of-way for broadband infrastructure. In return, broadband providers must allow Idaho Transportation Department to use the broadband infrastructure for various public safety warnings. MOTION: Rep. Rubel made a motion to send H 640 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Rep. Mitchell said he will support the motion, but reserves the right to vote NAY on the floor. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Green will sponsor the bill on the floor.
