CONVENED: Chairman Martin called to order the Senate Health and Welfare Committee

(Committee) at 3:01 p.m.

H 561 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES - Amends existing law to provide for

uses of moneys in the Emergency Medical Services Fund III. Representative Rubel introduced herself to the Committee. She stated there is an EMS III fund which was funded by a small surcharge on drivers licenses. The fund was only to be used for ambulances and equipment. Representative Rubel reported the greatest pressure was personnel who were usually volunteers and the need to train them also for dispatch and software costs. Mike McGrane introduced himself to the Committee. He provided background of the fund and detailed the changes

requested on H 561. (see Attachment 1)

TESTIMONY: Bill Arsenault, Fire Chief and Ambulance Director, Kamiah Fire-Rescue introduced

himself to the Committee. He testified for passage of this bill. (see Attachment 2)

DISCUSSION: Senator Wintrow asked about medical services being covered at the county level.

Mr. Arsenault responded that some counties provided that service through an ambulance taxing district but that was not done in his area. He stated they were fee for service which is provided through the city. Senator Wintrow inquired about a state answer for funding. Mr. Arsenault responded that use of the budget surplus would be beneficial. Senator VanOrden asked about the \$140,000 cap for a vehicle. Mr. Arsenault replied that the cap was increased this year to \$185,000 but when he recently spoke to a vendor the cost to purchase was at \$225,000 which would put them \$40,000 short. Senator VanOrden asked if they would buy an ambulance if they had the full funding. Mr. Arsenault responded yes but it would not work without the staffing. Senator VanOrden inquired about reservations paying for services. Mr. Arsenault reported that some provided reimbursement money or had set up their own services but some do not do either. He stated that

EMS treated everyone regardless of where they were located.

TESTIMONY: Bill Spencer, rural EMS, introduced himself to the Committee. He provided

background on the 400 square miles that his responders covered. Mr. Spencer stated his support for the bill with 1 caveat being that at least 60% be kept for

equipment.

VOTE: Senator Stennett moved to send H 561 to the floor with a do pass

recommendation. Senator Heider seconded the motion. The motion carried by

voice vote. Senator Nelson will carry on the floor.
