CONVENED: Chairman Martin called the meeting of the Senate Health and Welfare Committee

(Committee) to order at 3:07 p.m.

H 681 HEALTH - Repeals existing law relating to care of biological products.

Senator Mark Harris introduced himself to the Committee. The bill was a simple repeal of language made obsolete due to the passage of **H 445** earlier this session.

All three sections of Chapter 15 in title 39 would be removed.

MOTION: Senator Heider moved to send H 681 to the floor with a do pass recommendation.

Senator Lee seconded the motion. The motion carried by voice vote. Senator

Harris will carry the bill on the floor.

H 562 PHARMACISTS - Amends existing law to revise provisions regarding drug

outlets. **Representative Marco Erickson** introduced himself to the Committee. In accordance with the Licensing Freedom Act, this bill simplified the process for pharmacies. He reported pharmacies could now choose between 2 types of

licensing, in state or out of state instead of the 5 previous choices.

MOTION: Senator Stennett moved to send H 562 to the floor with a do pass

recommendation. Senator Heider seconded the motion. The motion carried by

voice vote. Senator Martin will carry the bill on the floor.

H 598 GENETIC TESTING PRIVACY ACT - Amends existing law to provide a certain

exception regarding DNA analysis for quality control. Representative David Cannon introduced himself to the Committee. The legislation added an exception to the Idaho Genetic Testing Privacy Act which was passed in 2006. Federal statute had an exception that Idaho law did not have. Forensic labs required employee DNA to rule out contamination. This exemption protected employee DNA from being uploaded into the federal database. In order for Idaho to access the federal

database the Idaho law needed to match federal law.

MOTION: Senator Wintrow moved to send H 598 to the floor with a do pass

recommendation. Senator Riggs seconded the motion. The motion carried by

voice vote. Senator Wintrow will carry the bill on the floor.

H 603 HOSPITAL DISTRICTS - Adds to existing law to allow for the sale, lease,

or conveyance of hospital district property. Representative Rod Furniss introduced himself to the Committee. This legislation would allow the 7 district hospitals to have the same ability as county hospitals to lease or sell property to

perpetuate the services in that community.

DISCUSSION: Senator Wintrow asked why this would better serve these hospitals. Toni Lawson, Vice President, Government Relations, Idaho Hospital Association introduced herself to the Committee. She answered that hospitals would be able to lease, with all the appropriate considerations, to a non-profit allowing them to get grants and fund raise where government entities cannot. Senator Lee moved to send H 603 to the floor with a do pass recommendation. MOTION: Senator Stennett seconded the motion. The motion carried by voice vote. Senator VanOrden will carry the bill on the floor. ADJOURNED: There being no further business at this time, Chairman Martin adjourned the meeting at 3:20 p.m. Senator Martin Lena Amoah Secretary Chair
