Introduction, First Reading, and Reference of Bills, House Petitions, Resolutions, and Memorials

S 1248 BY JUDICIARY AND RULES COMMITTEE AN ACT

RELATING TO SEXUAL OFFENDERS; AMENDING SECTION 18-8303, IDAHO CODE, TO REMOVE A DEFINITION AND TO REVISE DEFINITIONS; REPEALING SECTION 18-8312, IDAHO CODE, RELATING TO THE SEXUAL OFFENDER MANAGEMENT BOARD; REPEALING SECTION 18-8313, IDAHO CODE, RELATING TO REMOVAL OF BOARD MEMBERS; AMENDING SECTION 18-8314, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION SHALL HAVE CERTAIN POWERS AND DUTIES, TO REMOVE A PROVISION REGARDING A PROCESSING FEE, TO PROVIDE A CODE REFERENCE, TO AUTHORIZE CREATION OF AN ADVISORY PANEL, TO PROVIDE FOR MEMBERSHIP OF THE PANEL, TO PROVIDE FOR A CHAIR OF THE PANEL, TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE CORRECTIONS SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE DEVELOPMENT AND APPROVAL OF CERTAIN STANDARDS, POLICIES, AND RULES, AND TO PROVIDE FOR CERTIFICATIONS IN GOOD STANDING; REPEALING SECTION 18-8315, IDAHO CODE, RELATING TO COMPLIANCE WITH OPEN MEETINGS; AMENDING SECTION 18-8316, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION SHALL COMPILE A ROSTER OF CERTIFIED EVALUATORS AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION SHALL ESTABLISH CERTAIN STANDARDS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

<u>S 1248</u> was introduced, read the first time at length, and referred to the Judiciary and Rules Committee for printing.

The Senate advanced to the Twelfth Order of Business.

Second Reading of Bills

<u>H</u> 385, by Revenue and Taxation Committee, was read the second time at length and filed for third reading.

<u>§ 1216</u>, by Transportation Committee, was read the second time at length and filed for third reading.

The Senate advanced to the Thirteenth Order of Business.

Third Reading of Bills

<u>S</u> 1220, having been held, was read the third time at length, section by section, and placed before the Senate for final consideration. Senator Anthon arose as sponsor of the bill and opened the debate. The question being, "Shall the bill pass?"
