Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 67-5291, Idaho Code, the Legislature must approve pending administrative rules by adoption of a concurrent resolution; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 67-5291, Idaho Code, any pending rule that is not approved by adoption of a concurrent resolution shall expire upon adjournment sine die of the legislative session during which the agency submits the pending rule to the Legislature for review; and

WHEREAS, the Senate Commerce and Human Resources Committee and the House Business Committee reviewed pending rules adopted by the Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses, Rules of the Idaho Electrical Board; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that it is in the public interest to adopt this resolution.

I have the honor to advise you that I have signed on March 25, 2024 and am transmitting to the Secretary of State the following Senate Bill, to wit:

SENATE BILL 1283

within the time prescribed by law, the same having arrived in the Office of the Governor at the hour of 4:52 p.m. on March 19, 2024.

I support the merits of the legislation to ensure that temporary and seasonal employees are not inadvertently subject to benefits they would no longer qualify for in rare years where a crisis event causes them to work more than anticipated. Both the employer and the employee should not be subject to contributions in this instance. Senate Bill 1283 provides local soil and water conversation districts with additional flexibility to appropriately plan and prepare for the ongoing prevention and monitoring of invasive species.

Idaho Code 73-101 provides that no part of Idaho Code is retroactive unless expressly declared to be retroactive. Senate Bill 1283 contains this express declaration of emergency need to retroactively apply this legislative action. In this instance, due to the extremely unique nature of the battle against invasive species and the need for soil and water conservation districts to act, both in the past and in the future, the language in Senate Bill 1283, and only Senate Bill 1283, is appropriate.
