HOUSE BILL NO. 401 BY REVENUE AND TAXATION COMMITTEE AN ACT

RELATING TO TAXATION; AMENDING SECTION 63-602G, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR IMPROPER HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION CLAIMS, TO PROVIDE QUALIFICATIONS, TO PROVIDE PROCEDURES FOR APPEALS, AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS; AMENDING SECTION 63-3077, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE PROVISIONS REGARDING TAXPAYER INFORMATION COLLECTED BY THE STATE TAX COMMISSION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

<u>H 400</u> and <u>H 401</u> were introduced, read the first time by title, and referred to the Judiciary, Rules, and Administration Committee for printing.

There being no objection, the House advanced to the Tenth Order of Business.

H 385 - TAXATION
