## HOUSE BILL NO. 411 BY EDUCATION COMMITTEE

AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION DATA; AMENDING SECTION 33-133, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE PROVISIONS REGARDING EDUCATION DATA AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

## HOUSE BILL NO. 412 BY TRANSPORTATION AND DEFENSE COMMITTEE

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE IDAHO TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT; AMENDING SECTION 40-511, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF TECHNOLOGY AND PROCEDURES TO ALLOW CERTAIN VEHICLES TO LAWFULLY BYPASS A PORT OF ENTRY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

## HOUSE BILL NO. 413 BY TRANSPORTATION AND DEFENSE COMMITTEE

AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION; AMENDING SECTION 49-443, IDAHO CODE, TO REMOVE PROVISIONS REGARDING THE EXPIRATION OF LICENSE PLATES AFTER TEN YEARS, TO PROVIDE FOR THE VALIDITY OF CERTAIN READABLE AND LEGIBLE LICENSE PLATES, AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS; AMENDING SECTION 49-443B, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE FOR THE VALIDITY OF CERTAIN LICENSE PLATES ON STATE VEHICLES AND VEHICLES BELONGING TO TAXING DISTRICTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

## HOUSE BILL NO. 414 BY TRANSPORTATION AND DEFENSE COMMITTEE

AN ACT

**MOTOR** VEHICLE RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES; AMENDING SECTION 49-306, IDAHO **PROVISIONS** TO REVISE REGARDING CODE, DRIVER'S LICENSE FEES, TO PROVIDE FOR DRIVER'S ALLOCATIONS, LICENSE FEE TO AUTHORIZE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT OF REQUEST CERTAIN INFORMATION TO DETERMINE APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY, AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS; **AMENDING** SECTION IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE PROVISIONS REGARDING COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE RENEWAL AND TO MAKE A TECHNICAL CORRECTION; AMENDING SECTION 49-322, IDAHO CODE, TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO DOWNGRADE AND REINSTATE A COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS; AMENDING SECTION 33-4904, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE A PROVISION REGARDING REVENUE CREDITED TO THE MOTORCYCLE SAFETY PROGRAM FUND AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS; AMENDING SECTION 49-2447, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE A PROVISION REGARDING CERTAIN DONATIONS AND TO MAKE A TECHNICAL CORRECTION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

H 411, H 412, H 413, and H 414 were introduced, read the first time by title, and referred to the Judiciary, Rules, and Administration Committee for printing.

There being no objection, the House advanced to the Tenth Order of Business.
