AN ACT

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE; AMENDING SECTION 18-918, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE A PENALTY AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

HOUSE BILL NO. 391 BY JUDICIARY, RULES AND ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

AN ACT

RELATING TO EXPLICIT SYNTHETIC MEDIA; AMENDING CHAPTER 66, TITLE 18, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 18-6606, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE FOR THE CRIME OF DISCLOSING EXPLICIT SYNTHETIC MEDIA, TO PROVIDE PENALTIES, AND TO DEFINE TERMS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

<u>H</u> 387, <u>H</u> 388, <u>H</u> 389, <u>H</u> 390, and <u>H</u> 391 were introduced, read the first time by title, and referred to the Judiciary, Rules, and Administration Committee for printing.
