AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1

On page 1 of the printed bill, in line 20, delete "and"; in line 21, delete "." and insert: "for any courthouse;"; following line 21, insert:

- "(c) All law enforcement facilities;
- (d) All places of involuntary confinement, including:
 - (i) Prisons and jails established pursuant to tile 20, Idaho Code; and
 - (ii) Entities managed and operated pursuant to section 56-203, Idaho Code; and
- (e) A city, county, or other political subdivision of the state in order to regulate child care facility safety standards."; in line 22, delete "(2)" and insert: "(3)"; and in line 26, delete "(3)" and insert: "(4)".

CORRECTION TO TITLE

On page 1, in line 5, following "KNIVES" insert: ", TO PROVIDE CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS,".

HOUSE AMENDMENT TO H.C.R. NO. 24

AMENDMENT TO THE RESOLUTION

On page 1 of the printed resolution, following line 7, insert: "WHEREAS, State Highway 95 is the primary north-south highway in Idaho and is a vital transportation corridor between the Boise metropolitan area and the Canadian border; and"; delete lines 9 and 10, and insert: "traffic on State Highway 55 and State Highway 95, resulting in significant traffic congestion during high-volume periods, including the months of June,"; following line 24, insert:

"WHEREAS, a railroad right-of-way that is not currently being used follows a similar route as Highway 55 between Horseshoe Bend and Cascade; and

WHEREAS, State Highway 55 and State Highway 95 are vital to the economies of the communities within their transportation corridors, and it is critical that such communities not be adversely affected by any changes to such transportation corridors; and";

in line 30, delete "central Idaho" and insert: "Canada"; and in line 42, delete "central Idaho" and insert: "Canada".

On page 2, in line 8, delete "and of" and insert: "unused railroad rights-of-way,"; delete line 9, and insert: "travel between Canada and the Treasure Valley, and the economic impacts of any proposed solutions on existing communities within the State Highway 55 and State Highway 95 corridors."; and in line 18, following "issues," insert: "economics,".

HOUSE AMENDMENT TO H.B. NO. 621

AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 35 through 38, and insert:

- "(b) "Homeowner's association" includes the following persons who may or may not be members of a homeowner's association or serve on the board of a homeowner's association:
 - (i) A community manager pursuant to a contract with a homeowner's association; and
 - (ii) An agent or person with explicit or apparent authority to act on behalf of a homeowner's association."
