Idaho is one of the fastest growing states in the country because of our strong economy, safe neighborhoods, abundant outdoor activities, and great employment opportunities. However, the rapid growth has resulted in housing shortages. Coupled with high interest rates, it has become increasingly difficult for many Idahoans to afford housing. Affordable housing continues to be one of the most important issues facing Idahoans. Elected leaders in both rural communities and larger cities are working to address their unique housing needs and challenges.

I strongly believe in Idaho's long tradition of respecting, upholding, and defending Idahoans' private property rights. We must have laws in place that protect property owners from local laws and ordinances that limit their ability to manage their property and determine their tenants. That said, I am also a strong believer in local control, where the locally elected leaders are best situated to develop solutions that fit their communities and neighborhoods.

The State of Idaho has worked hard to deliver meaningful, enduring property tax relief over the past several years to help alleviate some of the challenges in housing affordability. However, high rental costs remain a problem as our population grows and puts pressure on housing availability. I urge the Legislature to work with local leaders to ensure our state laws provide pathways to solving local housing issues.

I signed House Bill 596aaS, with reluctance. I am supportive of pharmacy benefit managers reform and share the same concerns as the bill sponsors related to drug pricing. However, I am concerned this bill creates government interference in private contracts between businesses, and I fear it may ultimately increase costs for consumers.

House Bill 596aaS defines the specific type of contracts that health insurance plans can utilize to manage pharmacy costs, and the bill mandates an unspecified dispensing fee for prescription drugs. I am concerned these provisions could unintentionally result in increased health insurance costs that ultimately get passed on to employers in their employee benefit plans or in higher deductibles and premiums for individuals, or both, including our own state health benefit plan.

I appreciate the bill sponsors for taking on this complicated issue. While I am not convinced this is the perfect solution, I agree there is a need to increase transparency and eliminate fraud, waste, and abuse in providing pharmacy benefits. I also agree we need to ensure all Idahoans have access to the medicines they need through a system of pharmacies throughout the state and that our

policies should ensure pharmacists are able to continue providing services to our citizens.

I signed this bill with the expectation that stakeholders will monitor these concerns and are prepared to act accordingly in future legislative sessions until we find the right resolution for Idaho businesses and consumers.

Maintaining safety and access to Idaho's roads and highways is imperative because Idahoans rely on our transportation system to commute to work, transport goods, and travel throughout the state. Historically, the decision to close access to Idaho highways has been under the authority of Idaho State Police (ISP) and the Idaho Transportation Department (ITD). These two state agencies also have the responsibility for road maintenance and monitoring while ensuring the appropriate amount of personnel and equipment are available to remove snow and rocks, manage traffic, and address other barriers to safeguard access on the roads.

County sheriffs also play a critical role in maintaining safety and access to travel. House Bill 513 expands the authority to close access to Idaho highways to the Idaho county sheriffs' offices. For this new extension of authority to be effective, ISP, ITD, and Idaho county sheriff offices will need to align expectations and priorities. The priority should be keeping access open to roads and highways whenever possible. While nothing in this legislation delegates a county sheriff's authority to direct state resources, successful implementation requires seamless coordination and cooperation with all state and county entities involved.

We appreciate the partnership of state and local units of government working together to maintain our roads and highways. I urge ITD and ISP to work closely with the counties to outline standards and align processes for road and highway access and maintenance.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, Interstate Highway 84 is a vital highway that provides the primary vehicular travel connection between the Oregon state line and the Utah state line, passing through the Treasure Valley, the Magic Valley, and southeastern Idaho; and

WHEREAS, as many as 149,000 vehicles per day travel past the Five Mile Road overpass on I-84; and

WHEREAS, as the population of Idaho has increased, so too has vehicle traffic on I-84, resulting in significant traffic congestion during high-volume periods; and

WHEREAS, according to the Idaho Transportation Department, the volume of traffic on I-84 is projected to increase by 40% to 50% over the next 20 years between the Flying Wye interchange and the Franklin Road exit in Caldwell; and

WHEREAS, with increased traffic congestion there have been increased vehicle accidents, injuries, and fatalities; and

WHEREAS, traffic accidents and other emergency situations that occur on I-84 inevitably result in unsafe conditions and delays; and

WHEREAS, many commuters in the Treasure Valley currently experience delays and inconveniences during their daily commutes; and

WHEREAS, existing alternative roads near I-84 are limited in speed, number, and capacity, and alternative roads are becoming congested; and

WHEREAS, a beltway to the north or south of I-84 has been discussed as a potential alternative route; and

WHEREAS, enhancing Idahoans' options for vehicle travel and planning for future growth through the I-84 corridor between the Sand Hollow Road exit in Canyon County and the Blacks Creek Road exit in Ada County would reduce traffic accidents, address present and future congestion, and promote tourism and agribusiness, all of which are crucial to maintaining a healthy state economy; and

WHEREAS, there is currently no plan to address present traffic congestion, the impact of Highway 16 connecting to I-84, and future increases of the use of the I-84 corridor; and

WHEREAS, identifying alternative routes for vehicular travel would help ensure the safe and expedient movement of vehicles, materials, supplies, and people, thereby improving Idahoans' quality of life.
