## Introduction, First Reading, and Reference of Bills, House Petitions, Resolutions, and Memorials

## S 1243 BY RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE AN ACT

RELATING TO GRAZING; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE INTENT; AMENDING CHAPTER 3, TITLE 58, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 58-303, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE FOR CERTAIN GRAZING PERMITS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

## S 1244 BY JUDICIARY AND RULES COMMITTEE

AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS; AMENDING SECTION 18-2318, IDAHO CODE, TO PROHIBIT ELECTIONEERING AT CERTAIN POLLING PLACES, TO PROVIDE CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS, TO PROVIDE PROVISIONS FOR ENFORCEMENT, AND TO REVISE PROVISIONS REGARDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

§ 1243 and § 1244 were introduced, read the first time at length, and referred to the Judiciary and Rules Committee for printing.

<u>H</u> 387, by Judiciary, Rules and Administration Committee, was introduced, read the first time at length, and referred to the Judiciary and Rules Committee.

The Senate advanced to the Twelfth Order of Business.

### Second Reading of Bills

<u>§ 1223, § 1225,</u> and <u>§ 1236,</u> by State Affairs Committee, were read the second time at length and filed for third reading.

The Senate advanced to the Thirteenth Order of Business.

## Third Reading of Bills

On request by Senator Lee, granted by unanimous consent, <u>S 1220</u> retained its place on the Third Reading Calendar for one legislative day.

<u>S 1226</u> was read the third time at length, section by section, and placed before the Senate for final consideration. President Pro Tempore Winder arose as sponsor of the bill and opened the debate. The question being, "Shall the bill pass?"
