Senate Chamber

#### BY EDUCATION COMMITTEE AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL FUNDS; AMENDING CHAPTER 9, TITLE 33, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 33-912, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS REGARDING TEACHER SPENDING ACCOUNTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

#### S 1252

#### BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NATIONAL GUARD; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE INTENT; AMENDING CHAPTER 23, TITLE 67, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 67-2360, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEFEND THE GUARD ACT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

[S 1249](#), [S 1250](#), [S 1251](#), and [S 1252](#) were introduced, read the first time at length, and referred to the Judiciary and Rules Committee for printing.

On request by Senator Anthon, granted by unanimous consent, the Senate advanced to the Thirteenth Order of Business.
