RELATING TO CHILDREN'S DEVICE PROTECTION; AMENDING TITLE 48, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW CHAPTER 21, TITLE 48, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE A SHORT TITLE, TO PROVIDE A DECLARATION OF POLICY, TO DEFINE TERMS, TO REQUIRE INTERNET FILTERING ON CERTAIN DEVICES, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS REGARDING MANUFACTURER LIABILITY, AND TO PROVIDE FOR ATTORNEY GENERAL PROCEEDINGS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

RELATING TO PEACE OFFICER'S DAY; AMENDING CHAPTER 1, TITLE 73, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 73-108E, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH MARCH 13 AS PEACE OFFICER'S DAY IN IDAHO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

# S 1256 BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTED PUBLIC OFFICIALS; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE INTENT; AMENDING CHAPTER 4, TITLE 74, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 74-408, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS FOR THE DISQUALIFICATION FROM OFFICE OF ELECTED PUBLIC OFFICIALS CONVICTED OF CERTAIN CRIMES WHILE IN OFFICE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

<u>§ 1253</u>, <u>§ 1254</u>, <u>§ 1255</u>, and <u>§ 1256</u> were introduced, read the first time at length, and referred to the Judiciary and Rules Committee for printing.
