# SCR 132 BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND APPROVING PENDING RULES OF THE DIVISION OF OCCUPATIONAL AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE REVIEWED BY THE SENATE COMMERCE AND HUMAN RESOURCES COMMITTEE, WITH AN EXCEPTION.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 67-5291, Idaho Code, the Legislature must approve pending administrative rules by adoption of a concurrent resolution; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 67-5291, Idaho Code, any pending rule that is not approved by adoption of a concurrent resolution shall expire upon adjournment sine die of the legislative session during which the agency submits the pending rule to the Legislature for review; and

WHEREAS, the Senate Commerce and Human Resources Committee reviewed pending rules adopted by the Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses and the Department of Insurance; and WHEREAS, it is the finding of the Legislature that certain rules of the Department of Insurance, The Managed Care Reform Act Rule, are not consistent with legislative intent; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that it is in the public interest to adopt this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-seventh Idaho Legislature, the Senate and the House of Representatives concurring therein, that the following pending rules adopted by the Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses, Rules of the Public Works Contractors License Board, and the Department of Insurance, The Managed Care Reform Act Rule, pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act and submitted through the Office of the Administrative Rules Coordinator to the Legislature for review during the 2024 legislative session and reviewed by the Senate Commerce and Human Resources Committee, be, and the same are hereby approved, with the exception of IDAPA 18.04.04, The Managed Care Reform Act Rule, Docket No. 18-0404-2301, Section 011., Subsection 03., only, that is rejected and not approved, and thereby pursuant to Section 67-5291, Idaho Code, shall expire upon adjournment sine die of the legislative session and be null, void, and of no force and effect.
