I hereby advise you that I am returning to you, without my approval, disapproved and vetoed, the following Senate Bill, to wit:

# Senate Bill 1323

within the time limited by law, the same having arrived in the Office of the Governor at the hour of 1:40 p.m. on April 3, 2024.

While this legislation sought to clarify terms within Title 61, Idaho Public Utility Regulation, I am concerned it would have unintended consequences on Idaho ratepayers. I am vetoing this bill because it would create a carveout for water companies to operate in Idaho as a monopoly. By exempting these water companies, their customers in Idaho would be without the Idaho Public Utilities Commission's protections regarding fair, just and reasonable rates, safe and reliable service, and consumer protection.

Less than two-thirds having voted in the affirmative, the President declared that  $\underline{S}$  1323 has failed to become law, the Governor's veto sustained.  $\underline{S}$  1323 and the Governor's message will be filed in the office of the Secretary of the Senate.

On request by Senator Anthon, granted by unanimous consent, the Senate advanced to the Fifteenth Order of Business.

Representatives Scott, Kingsley, and Gannon informed the Senate that the House had completed its business and was ready to adjourn *Sine Die*.
