AN ACT

RELATING TO MATERNAL MORTALITY; AMENDING SECTION 54-1806, IDAHO CODE, TO AU THORIZE THE BOARD OF MEDICINE TO COLLECT INFORMATION ON INSTANCES OF MA TERNAL MORTALITY AND TO REQUIRE A REPORT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND
 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

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7 SECTION 1. That Section 54-1806, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 8 amended to read as follows:

54-1806. POWERS AND DUTIES. The board shall have the authority to:

(1) Establish, pursuant to the administrative procedure act, rules for
administration of this chapter, including rules establishing procedures for
the receipt of complaints and for the investigation and disposition thereof.
Such rules shall provide for notice to a person when board staff has undertaken to investigate that person and shall provide an opportunity for a person under investigation to meet with the committee or board staff before the
initiation of formal disciplinary proceedings by the board.

(2) Conduct investigations and examinations and hold hearings as au-thorized by this section and by section 54-1806A, Idaho Code.

(3) The board shall have the power in any investigation or disciplinary 19 proceeding pursuant to this chapter to administer oaths, take depositions 20 of witnesses within or without the state in the manner consistent with rules 21 22 adopted by the board pursuant to the administrative procedure act and, upon a 23 determination that there is good cause, the board shall have power throughout the state of Idaho to require the attendance of such witnesses and the 24 production of such books, records, and papers as it may deem appropriate for 25 any investigation, deposition or hearing. For that purpose, the board may 26 issue a subpoena for any witnesses, or a subpoena duces tecum to compel the 27 production of any books, records, or papers, directed to the sheriff of any 28 county of the state of Idaho where such witness resides or may be found, which 29 subpoena shall be served and returned in the same manner as a subpoena in a 30 criminal case is served and returned. The fees and mileage of the witnesses 31 shall be the same as that allowed in the district courts in criminal cases, 32 which fees and mileage shall be paid from any funds in the state treasury in 33 the same manner as other expenses of the board are paid. In any case of dis-34 obedience to, or neglect of, any subpoena or subpoena duces tecum served upon 35 36 any person, or the refusal of any witness to testify to any matter regarding which he may lawfully be interrogated, it shall be the duty of the dis-37 trict court of any county in this state in which such disobedience, neglect 38 or refusal occurs, or any judge thereof, on application by the board to com-39 pel compliance with the subpoena by proceedings for contempt as in the case 40 of disobedience of the requirements of a subpoena issued from such court or 41 for refusal to testify therein. The licensed person accused in such formal 42

contested case shall have the same right of subpoena upon making application 1 2 to the board therefor. Seek injunctive relief prohibiting the unlawful practice of 3 (4)medicine. 4 5 (5) Make and enter into contracts. (6) Operate, manage, superintend and control the licensure of physi-6 7 cians and physician assistants. (7) Develop and submit a proposed budget setting forth the amount nec-8 essary to perform its functions. 9 (8) Perform such other duties as set forth in the laws of this state. 10 11 (9) Provide such other services and perform such other functions as are necessary to fulfill its responsibilities. 12 (10) Apply the provisions of section 12-117(5), Idaho Code, regarding 13 the assessment of costs and fees incurred in the investigation and prosecu-14 tion or defense of a licensee under this chapter. 15 16 (11) Share with the department of labor personal identifying information of persons licensed under the provisions of this chapter necessary for 17 the department of labor to identify workforce shortage areas in Idaho. The 18 information provided to the department of labor concerning any person li-19 censed under this chapter shall remain confidential and not subject to pub-20 21 lic disclosure, as required in section 74-106, Idaho Code. (12) (a) Collect and review data and information concerning maternal 22 mortality in the state of Idaho. The board shall have the power through-23 out the state of Idaho to require the production of all information 24 relating to any incidence of maternal mortality. 25 (b) The board shall provide an annual summary report no later than Jan-26 uary 31 each year to the legislature on the number of instances of mater-27 nal mortality and other information as determined by the board. 28

29 SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby 30 declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after 31 July 1, 2024.
