- **H 406:** Senator Todd Lakey and Rep. Hill presented H 406 regarding Fentanyl and mandatory minimums for convicted traffickers.
- ORIGINAL<br/>MOTION:Rep. Wroten made a motion to send H 406 to the floor with a DO PASS<br/>recommendation.
- **SUBSTITUTE** Rep. Cannon made a substitute motion to send H 406 to GENERAL ORDERS for amendment.

AMENDED Rep. Garner made a motion to send H 406 to the floor with NO SUBSTITUTE RECOMMENDATION.

MOTION:

Committee discussed homicidal language of legislation, intent provision, application to minors, confidence in law enforcement officer testimony, effectiveness of similar laws, differentiating between users and dealers, current rate of user incarceration, descriptions of trafficking, necessity of law enforcement tools, 322 Fentynal deaths in Idaho last year, and the drug threat to all demographics.

Committee inquired regarding waivers for juveniles, clarification of Fentanyl mixtures and quantities, dosage quantities related to intent and murder charges, explanation of "an indeterminate sentence of life", culpability regarding groups of college kids who use and death occurs, judicial discretion, legislative impact regarding open border with Mexico, China as the origin of precursor ingredients, statistics of drug related offenses, seizure rates, recidivism, and data regarding trafficking charges pled down to possession.

Rep. Garner made a motion to call for the previous question.

MOTION TO CALL FOR THE QUESTION:

	Committee discussed due process of law, accountability of law enforcement, the value of legislators' responsibilities, pressures from outside entities regarding Fentanyl legislation, complexity of the issue, and concerns regarding drug mixtures.
