CONVENED: Chairman Lent called the meeting of the Senate Education Committee (Committee)

to order at 3:06 p.m.

PRESENTATION: iDeal Idaho College Savings Program. Marilyn Whitney, Executive Director,

iDeal Idaho College Savings Program, presented about the program and gave a 2023 update (Attachment 1). She shared that the mission of the program was to help Idaho families pursue education through tax-advantaged savings. She presented program highlights from 2023 which included an increase in new accounts and in total program assets. She explained the benefits of 529 Savings Plans and reviewed investment options for all savers, which included individuals

and employers.

RS 30888C2 Relating to Proposing an Amendment to Section 9, Article IX of the

Constitution of Idaho, Relating to School Attendance. Senator Herndon provided a historical overview of Article IX, Section 9 of the Idaho State Constitution

and the number of times and reasons it was amended. He reviewed the development of Idaho Code related to the rights of parents and guardians to privately home school or privately educate their children. He explained that **RS** 30888C2 added wording to Article IX, Section 9 of the Idaho State Constitution to affirm what exists in Idaho Code, that custodial parents and guardians of any minor child in Idaho shall have the fundamental right to privately home educate such child, or to cause such child to be privately educated. Furthermore, the amendment

stated that those who privately home educate or caused their children to be privately educated shall be free from government regulation of such education.

Senator Ward-Engelking voiced concern about public monies potentially funding home school or private school options. **Senator Herndon** clarified that **RS**

30888C2 does not address public funding.

MOTION: Senator Lenney moved that RS 30888C2 be sent to print. Senator Toews

seconded the motion. The motion carried by voice vote. Senator Ward-Engelking

requested that she be recorded as voting nay.

ADJOURNED: There being no further business at this time, **Chairman Lent** adjourned the meeting

at 3:34 p.m.
