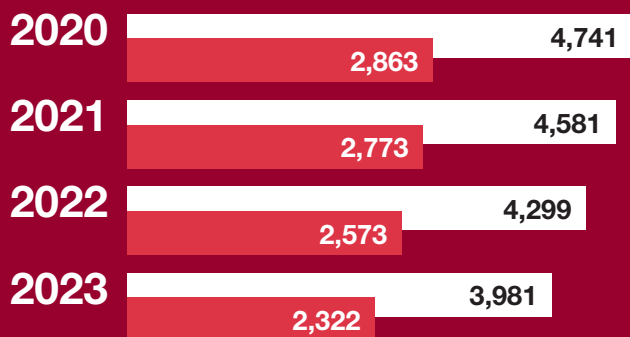




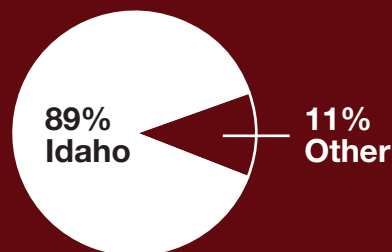

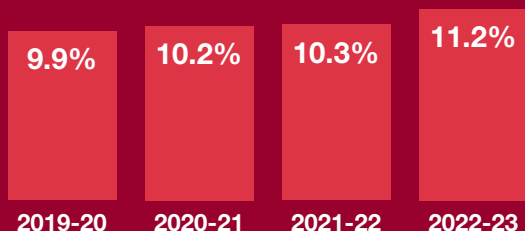
### New-Student Retention

### CTE Positive Placement Rate

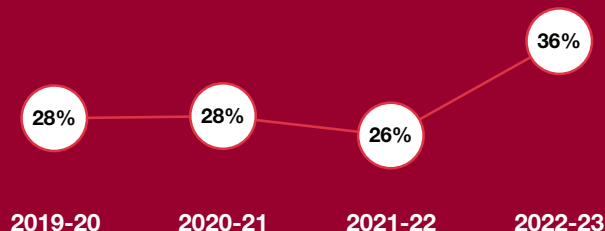

### First-Time Degree Seeking Headcount Spring 2024 Academic Transfer

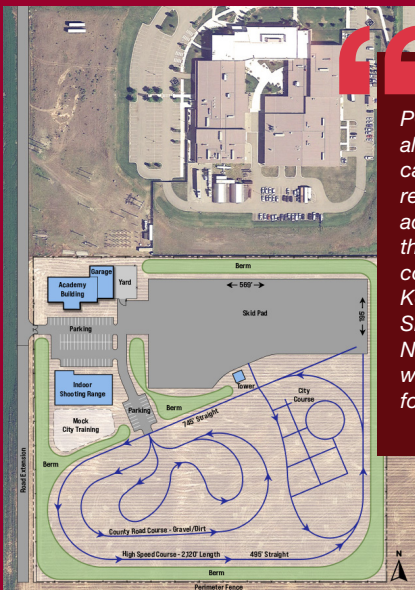

# Requests for Support

## POST Regional Training Center with Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC)

Training on an Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) is a state requirement, but the current facility is inadequate and has safety concerns. We propose building a new training center and EVOC track adjacent to NIC's Parker Technical Education Center in Rathdrum.

Fire departments, CDL classes, paramedics, and linemen can also train at the facility. It is strategically located to enhance training opportunities within our community.

## Health Professions and Nursing Funding

A shortage of health care workers in the region is exacerbated by graduates leaving for better salaries in the industry, hindering NIC's ability to attract and retain talent. Additionally, limited space and a required 10:1 student-to-faculty ratio makes expanding programs difficult.

Our funding request aims to strengthen our college's health professions and nursing programs by ensuring competitive wages and supporting collaborative efforts through a statewide Healthcare Workforce Shortage Advisory Group. The funding will encompass salary adjustments for health care instructors, an increase in part-time faculty costs, hiring two full-time faculty members, a .75 FTE simulation coordinator and an additional clinical coordinator to streamline student onboarding processes.
