GUBERNATORIAL Committee Consideration of the Gubernatorial Appointment of Paul Amador of Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, to the Public Charter School Commission

to serve a term commencing November 7, 2023 and expiring May 12, 2024. Paul Amador introduced himself and spoke about his background, education,

professional experience, and community service. He shared that he earned masters and doctorate degrees in educational leadership, and that he had professional experience in higher education administration. He reported that he served in the Idaho Legislature for six years during which time he was an advocate for public schools and charter schools. Mr. Amador expressed support for strong communities and the belief in the potential for education to change lives. He advocated for charter schools and appreciated that they offered families educational choices and that they fostered innovation. He stated that the Public

> **Amador** explained that he was appointed by the Governor to fulfill the term of someone who had stepped down from the commission. Senator Nichols asked Mr. Amador what were the opportunities and challenges that charter schools currently faced. Mr. Amador replied that charter schools faced challenges related to school funding, population growth, and changing demograhics.
