CONVENED: Chairman Guthrie called the meeting of the Senate State Affairs Committee

(Committee) to order at 11:15 a.m.

WELCOME: Chairman Guthrie welcomed all to the Committee meeting.

RS 31747 Relating to a Concurrent Resolution Denouncing Racism and Hate Speech.

Senator Lee stated that **RS 31747** was a resolution against hatred and racism. She referenced an incident in Coeur d'Alene, in which the University of Utah women's basketball team was targeted with racial harassment. **RS 31747** acknowledged what had happened and demonstrated that Idaho was not a welcoming place for hateful ideologies. It was important for the Legislature to present a pointed and clear statement that indicated the actions were not representative of the State of Idaho.

DISCUSSION: Senator Wintrow thanked the sponsors for bringing the resolution. She

appreciated the resolution.

Senator Bernt remarked that there were good people in northern Idaho, and the

incident didn't represent Idaho values.

MOTION: Senator Harris moved to send RS 31747 to print. Senator Wintrow seconded the

motion. The motion carried by voice vote.

PASSED THE GAVEL:

Chairman Guthrie passed the gavel to Vice Chairman Bernt.

H 727 PUBLIC UTILITIES - Adds to existing law to prohibit public utilities from

requiring the disclosure of full social security numbers as a condition of receiving any product, commodity, or service provided by the public utility and to provide an exception. Senator Guthrie stated that H 727 prohibited a public utility from requiring more than four digits of a customer's social security number in exchange for furnishing a product or service. In the event that a full social security number was needed for a credit check, then the records were

deleted within 10 days.

DISCUSSION: Vice Chairman Bernt noted there was nobody signed up to testify.

MOTION: Senator Lee moved to send H 727 to the floor with a do pass recommendation.

Senator Harris seconded the motion. The motion carried by **voice vote**.

GAVEL:

Vice Chairman Bernt passed the gavel back to the Chairman.

H 735 **APPROPRIATIONS - DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION - PERMANENT** BUILDING FUND - Relates to the appropriation to the Department of Administration for the Division of Public Works for fiscal year 2025. Senator Winder referred to page 3, section 8 of H 735, in which the session laws of 2022 were referenced. The language dealt with the Idaho Transportation Department relocation to the Chinden campus. He stated that H 735 interfered with a good faith process to surplus and dispose of the Idaho Transportation Department property and relocate the headquarters to the Chinden campus. He recommended that H 735 be held in Committee or sent to the 14th Order of Business for possible amendment. DISCUSSION: Chairman Guthrie noted there was nobody signed up to testify. Senator Lee moved to hold H 735 in Committee subject to the call of the chair. MOTION: **Senator Harris** seconded the motion. The motion carried by **voice vote**.
