Chairman Holtzclaw called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

MOTION: Rep. Wheeler made a motion to approve the minutes from January 23, 2024.

Motion carried by voice vote.

RS 31014: Rep. Bundy presented RS 31014, which will adjust the Unemployment Insurance

Fund size multiplier from 1.3 to 1.2 in Idaho Code 72-1350. Without adjusting the multiplier, a large tax increase will happen in 2024 after three years of frozen tax rates. The fiscal impact of this change is an estimate 44 million dollars in savings for Idaho businesses in 2024, and 117 million dollars over five years. There is no fiscal impact of the General Fund as these changes pertain to the Unemployment Insurance Program in the Associated Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund

Insurance Program in the Associated Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund.

VOTE ON MOTION:

Rep. Cheatum made a motion to introduce RS 31014. Motion carried by voice

vote.

RS 30912: Rep. Horman presented RS 30912. She stated one of the problems the state

has seen recently is hiring. The state has invested money into salaries, but there have been barriers in the way, such as the arbitrary degree requirement. This will expand the applicant pool for state jobs by using skills based hiring. The proposed legislation will require the state to hire based on skills, capabilities and experience

to evaluate job applicants.

Rep. Horman introduced **Rep. Wheeler** to review the jobs the proposed legislation will be effecting. He said a few examples are the IT positions, administration positions, and the career technical jobs. He is enthusiastic about this because it will

show students there are other opportunities available.

VOTE ON MOTION:

Rep. Miller made a motion to introduce RS 30912. Motion carried by voice vote.

RS 30815: Rep. Nelsen presented RS 30815. The RS addresses Idaho Code 59-1363 and

the specific time frame when a purchase of member service can be completed. RS 30815 defines how a member may request the cost of purchase of service within 90

days before a member's date of retirement.

VOTE ON MOTION:

Rep. Weber made a motion to introduce RS 30815. Motion carried by voice vote.

RS 30816: Rep. Nelsen presented RS 30816. The RS addresses Idaho Code 59-1352. The creation of the School Employee Member class moved school employees out of the general class into a class of their own. The current state code does not include the new defined class. This correction to statute will codify that the School Employee class will have access to the same disability retirement benefit they had when they were original members of the general class. VOTE ON Rep. Weber made a motion to introduce RS 30816. Motion carried by voice vote. MOTION: RS 30817: Rep. Nelsen presented RS 30817. The RS addresses Idaho Code 59-1308. He stated, in 2022, the Federal Congress passed the Secure Act 2.0 on catch-up contribution regulations. A qualified after-tax contribution investment option must be available to participate in catch-up contributions. Idaho Code 59-1308 will need to be updated to allow compliance with the Secure Act. Rep. Nelsen introduced Mike Hampton, Deputy Director at PERSI. He stated Idaho Code currently allows for pre-tax contributions and distributions for PERSI to be able to comply with the Secure Act. There needs to be action to update the code. VOTE ON Rep. McCann made a motion to introduce RS 30817. Motion carried by voice MOTION: vote. RS 30818: Rep. Nelsen presented RS 30818, which addresses Idaho Code 59-1316. Current code states that records are confidential; however, is missing the penalties and enforcement code. The RS will provide that member records are confidential but will not provide enforcement in the event of disclosure of confidential information. Additionally, **RS 30818** will provide further support in guashing subpoena for confidential information, without a court ordered directive. VOTE ON Rep. Cheatum made a motion to introduce RS 30818. Chairman Holtzclaw called the meeting to order at 1:29 pm.

H 428: Rep. Bundy presented H 428 to the committee. He stated this bill will be lowering

employers taxes, saving them 44 million dollars in net savings in the first year. He introduced **Jani Revier**, the Director of the Department of Labor, to present

in depth the content of H 428.

Jani Revier, Director of the Department of Labor, suggested a change in H 428 which would reduce the multiplier for the unemployment insurance program from 1.3 to 1.2. She provided a brief overview of how the program works, emphasizing its federal-state partnership and the funding mechanism through employer taxes. The current tax formula, based on Idaho Code 72-1350, considers the balance of the trust fund, revenue needed, and the high-cost benefit years over a two-decade period. The proposed change is driven by significant wage growth in recent years, leading to a shortfall in funds for maintaining 15.6 months of benefits. The adjustment aims to address this gap and align the system with the current economic landscape.

Those speaking **in support** were **Fred Birnbaum**, Idaho Freedom Foundation Boise, and **Joe Maloney**. They were of the opinion the bill will help point Idaho in

the right direction for the Unemployment Insurance Program.

MOTION: Rep. McCann made a motion to send H 428 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Bundy will sponsor the bill

on the floor.

H 429: Rep. Nelsen introduced H 429, which addresses Idaho Code 59-1363. When a

member is getting ready to retire, they have the option of purchasing 48 months of service. This bill sets the time-line of 90 days or less prior to retirement to

purchase those services.

MOTION: Rep. Roberts made a motion to send H 429 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Nelsen will sponsor the bill

on the floor.

H 430: Rep. Nelsen introduced H 430, which addresses Idaho Code 59-1352. The bill

adds school employee member to that section of code which was admitted to the

code by mistake.

MOTION: Rep. Weber made a motion to send H 430 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Nelsen will sponsor the bill

on the floor.

H 431:

Rep. Nelsen introduced **H 431**, which addresses Idaho Code 59-1308. Rep. Nelsen introduced the Executive Director for PERSI, **Mike Hampton**, to present in depth the content of **H 431**.

Mike Hampton, the Executive Director of PERSI, explained **H 431** aims to define contributions and investment earnings for the PERSI choice 401k plan. In his presentation, he provided a concise overview of the Secure Act 2.0. To ensure the state's compliance with the IRS code, there is a need to incorporate the option for after-tax contributions into the choice 401k plan. The language in **H 431** suggests an update to Idaho Code 59-1308, specifically addressing contributions and investment earnings under supplemental benefit plans, and introducing provisions for after-tax contributions.

MOTION:

Rep. Wheeler made a motion to send **H 431** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Nelsen** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

H 432:

Rep. Nelsen introduced **H 432**, which addresses Idaho Code 59-1316. The bill aims to amend current language in the bill to establish penalties for the disclosure of confidential member records. **H 432** also stops any subpoenas without judge involvement or court order to obtain confidential records.

MOTION:

Rep. Cheatum made a motion to send **H 432** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Nelsen** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

H 433:

Rep. Horman introduced **H 433.** She stated there has been difficulty in hiring. This bill takes a different approach by removing a barrier to hiring and expanding the applicant pool using skills-based hiring. Rep. Horman introduced **Rep. Wheeler**.

Rep. Wheeler stated Idaho will be leading the nation by supporting this bill. IT positions, administrative positions and several other agency positions will be positively affected by **H 433**.

Jonathan Wolfson, Cicero Action, spoke **in support** of the bill, stating this bill works alongside the Idaho LAUNCH program coherently.

MOTION:

Rep. Weber made a motion to send **H 433** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Horman** and **Rep.** Wheeler will sponsor the bill on the floor.

RS 31127: Rep. Redman introduced RS 31127 to add to Idaho employee law to prohibit

employment of illegal aliens and require employers to e-verify an employee's legal employment status as a condition of employment. This legislation causes no additional expenditures of funds at the state or local level of government nor does it cause an increase or decrease in revenue for state or local government;

therefore, the legislation has no fiscal impact.

MOTION: Rep. Roberts made a motion to introduce RS 31127. Motion carried by voice

vote.

RS 31193: Rep. Cheatum introduced RS 31193. The purpose of this RS is to add Peace

Officer Standards and Training (POST) certified juvenile detention supervisors, juveniles probation supervisors, adult misdemeanor supervisors, emergency communications supervisors and Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections to the Rule of 80 retirement plan as is currently conducted with their adult counterparts. This legislation will have no impact on the State's General Fund or any dedicated fund or federal fund. This proposal will demand an increase in the contribution by each individual employee biweekly of 3.65% per year, and a contribution by the county of 2.69% per year. This is based on an average PERSI member's salary of

\$50,000.

MOTION: Rep. Bundy made a motion to introduce RS 31193. Motion carried by voice vote.

DOCKET NO. Michelle Peugh, Idaho Department of Human Resources Bureau Chief, presented the pending rules for **Docket No. 15-0401-2301**. Michael Peugh stated there were

had two public meetings in August and accepted comments through October. Their revision fell into three main categories: Requirements which are already covered in a statute or federal law were removed; they consolidated redundant rules to make

He stated this RS would allow a city, country or district as defined in 72-301(6) and 72-928(d) to go to an open market for an insurer of choice for worker's compensation without having to secure its liability for payment of compensation with the state insurance fund. There will be no fiscal impact to state or local governments if this legislation passes because it does not create or expand any programs and does not require the expenditure of any funds
MOTION:	Rep. Hawkin s made a motion to introduce RS 31188 with the exemption of lines 44-46 on page 3 because the information is outdated. Motion carried by voice vote.
RS 31212:	Rep. Monks introduced RS 31212. He stated unlike other states, Idaho does not have a statutory process for appealing public works project awards. Until two years ago, there was no process at all. In 2022, the Division of Public Works and the Permanent building Fund Advisory Council adopted a policy to create a process. This bill codifies a challenge and appeals process, building on what has worked well over the past two years and making modifications where lessons have been learned. In the past two years, there have been five challenges to DPW projects. It the number of challenges remains about the same, this bill will not have a fiscal impact as challenges can be handled through existing staff.

	Craig Shaul, Research Analyst Supervisor for the Idaho Department of Labor, talked briefly on the worker shortage in Idaho, where the people are, and how to engage the working population to work. He stated the tight labor market will be here for the foreseeable future.

This will adjust the contribution of each employee by a small percentage.
	Rep. Erickson said the original intent of previous legislation is to add this class, you no other class is to be added in the future.
	Those speaking in support were Nick Sasser, Chief of Police for Chubbuck; Melissa Stroh; Susie Saunders; Nampa Police Dispatch; Matthew Clifford, Ada County Sheriff; Courtney Lyskoski, Ada County 911 Dispatch Supervisor. Emergency Communication Supervisors should be covered under the Rule of 80 as was intended in the original legislation and as both higher and lower positions apply. Emergency Communication Supervisors are still Emergency Communication Officers. Currently, while officers fall under this rule, promotion to supervisor would shift their retirement benefits to the Rule of 90, discouraging them from seeking advancement. This discrepancy could exacerbate the shortage of supervisors in Idaho, as qualified officers may opt to remain in their current roles. Failure to extend the Rule of 80 to supervisors could also hinder recruitment for leadership positions within dispatch, as it does not afford them the same retirement benefits as other emergency personnel like police and fire personnel.

other progressive states, particularly focusing on personal benefits. Rep. Skaug has collaborated extensively with various stakeholders, including individuals and small, independent businesses across Idaho. Highlighting the endorsement from the Idaho Farm Bureau, Rep. Skaug underlines the complexity of the current system, which offers 17 benefits but ranks Idaho 47th among the rest of the states. An important facet of the bill addresses seasonal workers, extending eligibility to fourteen weeks with an additional two weeks if the employer permits. In the context of Idaho's urgent need for robust workforce, ranking second in the nation for job growth, Skaug stresses the significance of addressing barriers to workforce participation, especially in the aftermath of the epidemic. Rep. Skaug introduced

Rep. Young to discuss the bill more in depth.

Rep. Young asserted that while the formula may seem intricate and require extensive numerical analysis, the proposed legislation is grounded in practical experience, aiming to benefit both small and large employers. Drawing on examples, she highlighted lowa's successful return to work trend and Arkansas's recent extension of unemployment benefits from sixteen to twelve weeks in January 2024, alluding to the stability of their respective formulas. Addressing concerns about the financial sustainability of the program, Rep. Young points out that employers bear the responsibility of funding the unemployment benefits. The legislation also offers a balanced approach, leveraging past successes and maintaining financial prudence to support both workers and employers effectively.

Those speaking in opposition were Shawn Keaough, Idaho Loggers Association; John Hughes, AFL-CIO; Ken Burgess, Idaho Home Builders Association; Jared Wise, General Manager of Interstate Concrete and Asphalt; Shawn Schupack, Idaho Associated General Contractors. There is an issue with seasonal workers who will exhaust their unemployment benefits during their off season.

Those speaking **in support** were **Brian Sikma**, FGA. He stated this bill will create a larger benefit for all of Idaho and will keep Idaho from needing a federal bailout.

This definition already applies to seasonal golf course, park, or other positions in cities, counties, irrigation

districts, cemetery districts, and mosquito abatement districts.

Tom Kealy, Director of the Idaho Department of Commerce, stated in rural Idaho, existing statutes greatly affect residents. **Kelly Packer** has long been a champion for rural communities, dedicating time and expertise, notably through her involvement with the Idaho Rural Partnership (IRP). The IRP is instrumental in fostering collaboration and tackling rural challenges. Recent efforts focus on amending these statutes, aiming to remove outdated language, adjust existing provisions, and introduce sunset clauses for regular program reviews. A diverse board of 35 members is involved in this process, highlighting the importance of these changes for rural Idaho's well-being.

MOTION: Rep. Cheatum made a motion to send S 1294 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Price requested to recorded as voting NAY. Rep. Furniss will sponsor the bill on the floor. S 1271: Rep. Ehlers presented S 1271, which involves cutting a government program associated with the Idaho Global Entrepreneurial Mission (IGEM). This initiative, established by the Department of Commerce in 2012 through legislative action, aimed to foster the growth of local startups and universities. While the program has seen success with several commendable projects, questions arise regarding the appropriateness of government involvement in such endeavors. As a member of the IGEM board, this concern was raised during our recent meeting. The proposal is to remove the program from the Department of Commerce budget, with an anticipated \$1 million reduction. MOTION: Rep. Wheeler made a motion to send S 1271 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Ehlers will sponsor the bill on the floor. S 1303aa: Rep. Cheatum presented S 1303aa. This bill involves updating a piece of Idaho legislation from 1982. There was an initial rough estimate made, prompting the development of a calculator. The rule pertains specifically to personal service contracts, such as those for performance or special services, with an expenditure threshold set at \$30,000. For instance, this might apply to contracts with attorneys. Rep. Bundy made a motion to send S 1303aa to the floor with a DO PASS MOTION: recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Cheatum will sponsor the bill on the floor. S 1299: Rep. Roberts introduced S 1299, which seeks to address an issue stemming from Idaho Code 44-2012, as highlighted by a 2015 court of appeals ruling declaring it unlawful. The bill aims to remove obsolete language pertaining to contracts, as identified at that stage. This matter was initially brought before the district court in 2013, with the final decision being rendered in 2015. MOTION: Rep. This bill concerns the choice for employees to remain in PERSI. This choice applies exclusively to new employees who join PERSI

before being hired by the state board, affecting only a small number, typically 2 to 3 employees per year. The crux of the matter lies in the fact that employees hired by the state board have not yet become vested in PERSI and therefore may not continue with it for their retirement benefits. Instead, they must decide between

remaining with PERSI or opting for a 401K plan.
