HOUSE BILL NO. 259

AN ACT RELATING TO ELECTIONS; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT; AMENDING 2 SECTION 67-6614A, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE PROVISIONS REGARDING THE PUBLI-3 CATION OR DISTRIBUTION OF POLITICAL STATEMENTS; AND DECLARING AN EMER-4 5 GENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. The Legislature finds that the State of Idaho has a substantial interest in preserving the integrity of the electoral process by combating voter confusion. Preventing voter confusion is crucial in facilitating secure elections because it directly impacts voter confidence, voter participation, and the overall integrity of the electoral process.

The Legislature further finds that when voters clearly understand the voting process and the information presented to them, they are more likely to trust the election outcomes. This trust is foundational for the perceived legitimacy of elected officials and the democratic system as a whole. Requiring the disclosure of party affiliation in the publication or distribution of political statements will help voters understand the information being presented to them in such statements as it will provide helpful context to assist them in processing the information they receive. Such party affiliation information is already required to be indicated on the declaration of candidacy forms for candidates running in partisan elections. The disclosure of party affiliation in political statements is a continuation of disclosure and transparency requirements already implemented in other areas of the electoral process.

The Legislature further finds that requiring party affiliation disclosure will assist in preventing voting errors such as selecting the wrong candidate or improperly marking a ballot. If voters are informed of the party affiliation of a candidate or of the political committee sponsoring a political statement, they will be less likely to vote for a candidate or measure that does not align with their values because the information they received lacked this valuable information. Reducing such errors ensures that votes are accurately cast and counted, reflecting the true will of the electorate.

The Legislature further finds that requiring party affiliation disclosure will assist in mitigating the impact of misinformation. Providing accurate and easily understandable information about the person publishing or distributing political statements, including such person's party affiliation, will assist in counteracting the effects of misinformation and disinformation. When voters are well-informed, they are less susceptible to false narratives that could influence their voting decisions or discourage them from voting altogether.

The Legislature further finds that clear and accurate communication concerning persons or entities publishing or distributing political statements reduces the burden on election officials by decreasing the number of voter inquiries and the need for corrective measures. This efficiency allows officials to focus on maintaining security protocols and managing the election process effectively.

The Legislature further finds that voter confusion can lead to unintentional disenfranchisement of voters, where voters are unable to successfully cast their ballots due to misunderstandings. Ensuring clarity in all election-related political statements helps protect the voting rights of all citizens.

It is therefore the intent of the Legislature, in order to facilitate the foregoing interests, to require any person who makes an expenditure for the financing of the publication or distribution of political statements to disclose with such statement the political affiliation of such person if such person is affiliated with a political party, and, if the political statement is in support of a candidate, the party affiliation of the candidate.

SECTION 2. That Section 67-6614A, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

67-6614A. PUBLICATION OR DISTRIBUTION OF POLITICAL STATEMENTS. Whenever any person makes an expenditure for the purpose of financing communications expressly advocating the election, approval or defeat of a candidate, measure or person standing for election to the position of precinct committeeman through any broadcasting station, newspaper, magazine, website, mobile application, text message, outdoor advertising facility, direct mailing, yard sign, bumper sticker, pamphlet, display card, poster, billboard, campaign button, or any other type of general public political advertising, the person responsible for such communication shall be clearly indicated on such communication as well as such person's political party affiliation, if any, and if the political statement is in support of a candidate the party affiliation of the candidate, if any.

SECTION 3. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2025.
