## HOUSE BILL NO. 295

1	AN ACT
2	RELATING TO EDUCATION; AMENDING CHAPTER 12, TITLE 33, IDAHO CODE, BY THE
3	ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 33-1204A, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS
4	REGARDING THE ADMINISTRATOR LEADERSHIP APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM; AND
5	DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:
7	SECTION 1. That Chapter 12, Title 33, Idaho Code, be, and the same is
8	hereby amended by the addition thereto of a NEW SECTION, to be known and des-
9	ignated as Section 33-1204A, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
10	33-1204A. ADMINISTRATOR LEADERSHIP APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM. (1) An
11	individual who does not otherwise hold an administrator certificate re-
12	quired to be a school principal or superintendent may meet the standards of
13	employment for such positions or similar positions by participating in and
14	successfully completing the administrator leadership apprenticeship pro-
15	gram as an apprentice in such positions.
16	(2) To qualify for the administrator leadership apprenticeship program
17	in a school principal role, an individual shall:
18	(a) Pass a criminal history check provided for in section 33-130, Idaho
19	Code;
20	(b) Hold, at a minimum, a bachelor's degree from a regionally or nation-
21	ally accredited college or university;
22	(c) Possess a professional background that demonstrates competency in
23	at least one (1) of the following disciplines:
24	(i) Higher education;
25	(ii) Governmental service in a management or leadership role;
26	(iii) Nonprofit organization service in a management or leader-
27	ship role;
28	(iv) Private sector service in a management or leadership role;
29	(v) Military service at the officer level; or
30	(vi) Some other education-related experience;
31	(d) Be sponsored by a public school district or local education agency;
32	and
33	(e) Be enrolled in or have previously successfully completed an administrator leadership program at a regionally accredited university
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35	domiciled in Idaho.

(a) Pass a criminal history check provided for in section 33-130, Idaho Code;

in a school district superintendent role, deputy superintendent role, or

other similar role, an individual shall:

(3) To qualify for the administrator leadership apprenticeship program

(b) Hold, at a minimum, a master's degree from a regionally or nationally accredited college or university;

- (c) Possess a professional background that demonstrates competency in at least one (1) of the following disciplines:
  - (i) Higher education;

- (ii) Governmental service in a management or leadership role;
- (iii) Nonprofit organization service in a management or leadership role;
- (iv) Private sector service in a management or leadership role;
- (v) Military service at the officer level; or
- (vi) Some other education-related experience;
- (d) Be sponsored by a public school district or local education agency; and
- (e) Be enrolled in or have previously successfully completed a superintendent leadership program at a regionally accredited university domiciled in Idaho.
- (4) An individual who is offered employment in a position by a school district in a school principal role, school district superintendent role, or other similar role as an apprentice for three (3) consecutive years shall be eligible to receive the same certificate as the certificate of others who are employed in the same role as long as such individual continues to comply with the applicable requirements set forth in this section and with all other applicable laws.
- (5) An individual who successfully completes the administrator leadership apprenticeship program and earns an administrator certificate shall be subject to ongoing review.
- SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage and approval.
