A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND ENCOURAGING CITIES, COUNTIES, AND OTHER GOVERNING BODIES TO SUPPORT YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, owning and operating a business provides valuable real-world experience, instills a strong work ethic, and teaches the importance of perseverance. Youth-run businesses, such as lemonade stands, lawn care services, or craft sales, foster community engagement and build a sense of local pride; and

WHEREAS, excessive regulation can stifle creativity and discourage young entrepreneurs from exploring business opportunities. Streamlining processes and eliminating permitting and licensure fees for small, youth-operated businesses ensures a more-accessible pathway to entrepreneurship; and

WHEREAS, hard work and enterprise are the bedrock of the American dream, inspiring generations to contribute to their communities and the economy. By empowering young people to start businesses, local governments can help cultivate the next generation of innovators and leaders.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the First Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, the House of Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that cities, counties, and other governing bodies are encouraged to: (1) Consider the potential benefits to our youth in encouraging exploration of entrepreneurship; (2) waive or eliminate permitting and licensure fees for businesses owned and operated by minors; (3) simplify or exempt youth businesses from certain regulatory requirements, while still maintaining public health and safety standards; and (4) create opportunities for young entrepreneurs to showcase their products or services through community events, fairs, or markets.
