HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 13

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND AUTHORIZING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO APPOINT A COMMITTEE TO UNDERTAKE AND COMPLETE A STUDY OF IDAHO LAWS RELATING TO INVOLUNTARY COMMITMENT FOR THE CUSTODY, CARE, AND TREATMENT OF PERSONS WITH MENTAL ILLNESSES, NEUROCOGNITIVE DISORDERS, AND TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURIES.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Idaho relating to involuntary commitment for the custody, care, and treatment of persons with mental illnesses, neurocognitive disorders, and traumatic brain injuries appear in numerous areas of Idaho Code, including Title 18, Title 56, and Title 66, Idaho Code; and

WHEREAS, these laws are lacking in coordinated objectives for the custody, care, and treatment of persons with mental illnesses, neurocognitive disorders, and traumatic brain injuries, while the medical community recognizes that persons with these conditions require similar facilities, settings, treatments, and provision of care; and

WHEREAS, establishing an interim committee will provide an opportunity to review and update Idaho Code as appropriate to address problems with the involuntary commitment process throughout the state.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the First Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, the House of Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that the Legislative Council is authorized to appoint a committee to undertake and complete a study of Idaho laws relating to involuntary commitment for the custody, care, and treatment of persons with mental illnesses, neurocognitive disorders, and traumatic brain injuries. The Legislative Council shall determine the number of legislators and membership from each house appointed to the committee and shall authorize the committee to receive input, advice, and assistance from interested and affected parties who are not members of the Legislature.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that nonlegislative members of the committee may be appointed by the cochairs of the committee who are appointed by the Legislative Council. Such nonlegislative members may include attorneys, medical providers, employees of the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, psychiatrists, or other professionals with relevant experience. Nonlegislative members of the advisory committee shall not be reimbursed from legislative funds for per diem, mileage, or other expenses and shall not have voting privileges regarding the committee's recommendations or proposed legislation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall report its findings, recommendations, and proposed legislation, if any, to the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature.
