

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

RS31922 / S1013

This bill brings from rule what must be taught in a hunter and trapping education course while also consolidating the requirements. It adds the requirement that students must receive instruction on trespassing and personal and real property tampering laws.

The bill also allows individuals to trap under the supervision of a certified guide without the individual being certified themselves. This allows the individual to receive hands on instruction and take the animals trapped without having to wait months to take a trapping education course. If that individual ever wishes to trap independently, they will still have to take the trapper education course but will have the additional experience.

FISCAL NOTE

This bill has no impact to the general fund because the bill consolidates requirements and will not take from general fund.
