### SENATE BILL NO. 1086

#### AN ACT

- RELATING TO TRESPASS; AMENDING CHAPTER 70, TITLE 18, IDAHO CODE, BY THE AD DITION OF A NEW SECTION 18-7045, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS RE GARDING A VIOLATION OF LANDOWNER RULES FOR PERMISSIBLE USE; AND DECLAR ING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

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SECTION 1. That Chapter 70, Title 18, Idaho Code, be, and the same is
hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and designated as Section 18-7045, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

- (a) "Government entity" means the United States of America and thoseentities provided for in section 6-902, Idaho Code.
- (b) "Land" shall have the same meaning as provided in section 36-1604,Idaho Code.
- (c) "Notice" means actual notice or constructive notice and includes
   posting signs at gates or road or trail entry points onto the land that
   state "use restrictions apply" or similar wording and provide a website
   address and phone number for contacting the government entity or owner.
- (d) "Owner" shall have the same meaning as provided in section 36-1604,
  Idaho Code.
- (e) "Recreational purposes" shall have the same meaning as provided in
   section 36-1604, Idaho Code.

(2) Whenever any government entity that manages or controls land, or
any owner of land, gives notice of and imposes closures, restrictions, regulations, or prohibitions in relation to use of the land for recreational purposes, any person who violates such closures, restrictions, regulations, or
prohibitions shall be guilty of trespass, punishable as provided in section
18-7008(3), Idaho Code.

30 SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby 31 declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after 32 July 1, 2025.
