

#### NATIONAL OUTLOOK


- Commercial in 2007 was in good shape
- Commercial up 15% in first 10 months of 07
- National Prediction is a 4% increase in 2008
- Housing and mortgage slowdown hasn't directly affected commercial
- Construction materials will increase 6-8% next year vs. 2-4% for inflation
- Construction materials increases will challenge state building & highway budgets

#### **IDAHO COMMERCIAL CONSTRUCTION**

- Difficult to distinguish between res & non-res because of cross-over
- 57,439 employed in construction (both res. & non-res thru June 07)
- × 55,315 in same period of 06
- 6.7% of Gross State Product
- ALL construction annual wages <u>average</u> \$17,906 in 07 vs. \$16,930 at the same time in 06
- New Non-Residential Value as of 9/30/07 is \$746.4 million vs. \$683.6 million as of 9/30/06
- \* 19,215 registered and active contractors as of 12/08/07
- 2,976 Public Works Contractors as of 1/2/08

#### **IDAHO OUTLOOK**

- Total construction value down 16.6% through August 2007 v. August 2006
- Residential value down 35.2% (8/07 vs. 8/06)
- Commercial construction value up 9.2% (8/07 vs. 8/06)
- Alterations & Repairs value up 25.6% (8/07 vs. 8/06)
  - + Source: Wells Fargo Idaho Construction Report
- Future Planning jobs are down a bit in the AGC Bid Information System (235 in 06 ytd vs. 207 this year)
- Idaho prediction is a 0-2% increase in commercial construction in 2008
- Beyond that? Depends on GARVEE, Transportation Funding and other legislative action
