- Agriculture is a GROWING industry in Idaho setting record cash receipts in five of the last seven years
- Idaho agriculture is diversified with 144 different commodities
- Food manufacturing is Idaho's second largest manufacturing sector. Together, agriculture and food processing are the backbone of much of rural Idaho
- World Class research (INL, U of I, Future ICLES Center)

Weaknesses



- Lack of reliable and consistent labor
- Increasing crop prices a two-edge sword. Balance between crop and livestock interests
- Lack of understanding of agricultural issues in growing urban centers
- Lack of access to reliable and affordable transportation – declining rail service, shortage of trucks, shortage of reefer containers

Opportunities



- Alternative uses for farm waste to supplement farm income
 - Biogas from livestock Methane
 - Biofuels ethanol and biodiesel
 - Carbon credits
- Round-up ready sugarbeets reduce costs
- Opportunities for value-added and premium, niche products
- National trend for local products
- Export growth, declining U.S. dollar



Threats

- Water-Water-Water
- Potential for shortage of seed potatoes
- Stricter regulatory environment
- Pest detections, invasives PCN, Water Milfoil
- CCD in honey bees (colony collapse disorder)
- Fuel prices
- Growing food safety concerns
- Trade restrictions
