Attached is a spreadsheet that includes the rankings of the states for percentage increase in total wages 2002-2007 and 2007 to 2012, average wage 2001, 2007 and 2012 and per capita income 2007 and 2012 on the first sheet and percentage of minimum wage jobs on the second.

It should be noted and this applies to the chart in the presentation this afternoon that the 5 percent minimum wage percentage for Idaho in 2011 appears to be a statistical mistake by the BLS based on the trend lines established for the rest of the years. That would be borne out by the plunge in state ranking for 2011 from the teens to 30th.
