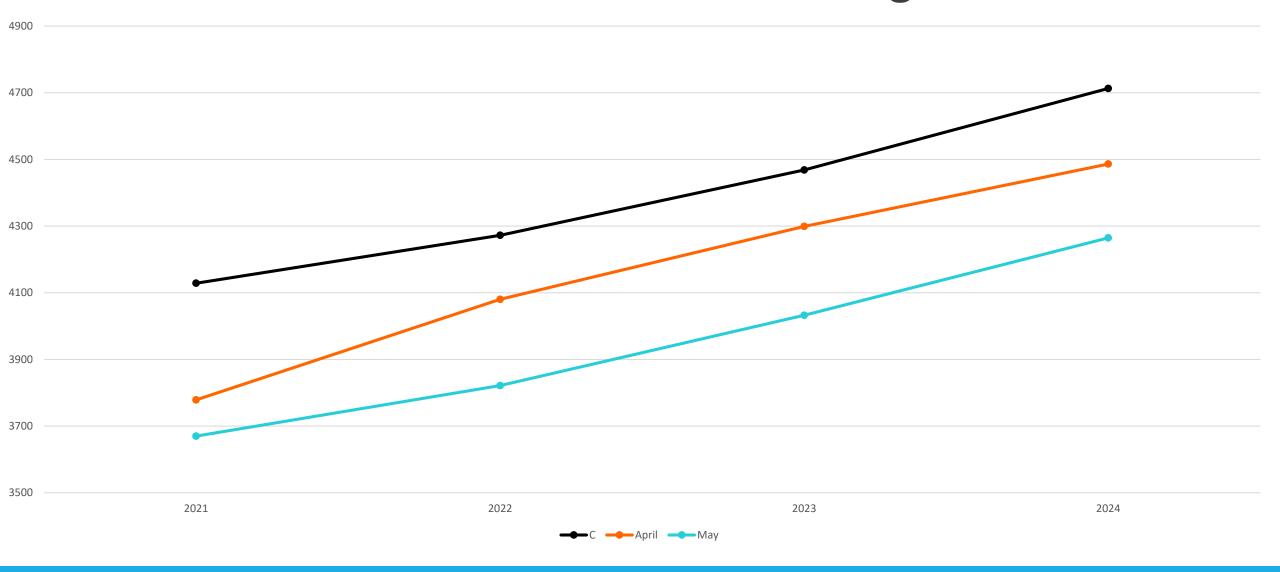

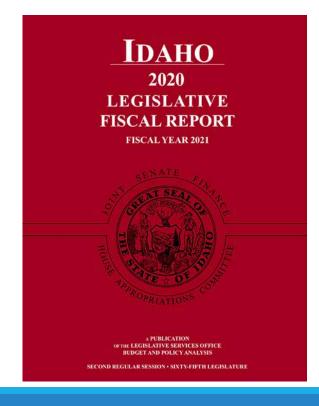

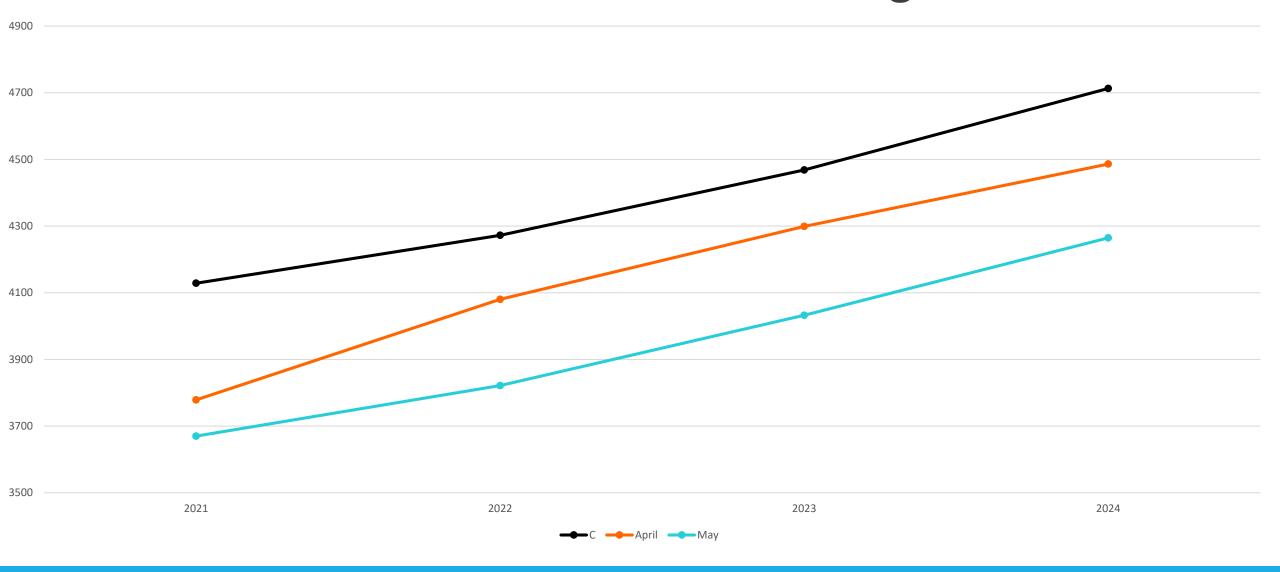

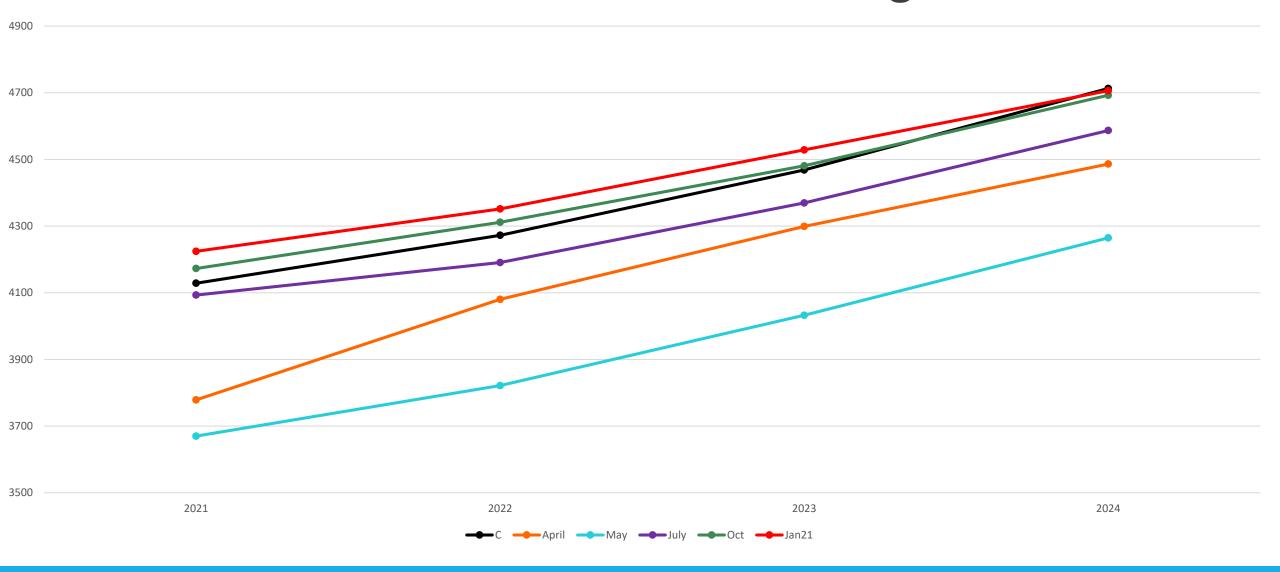

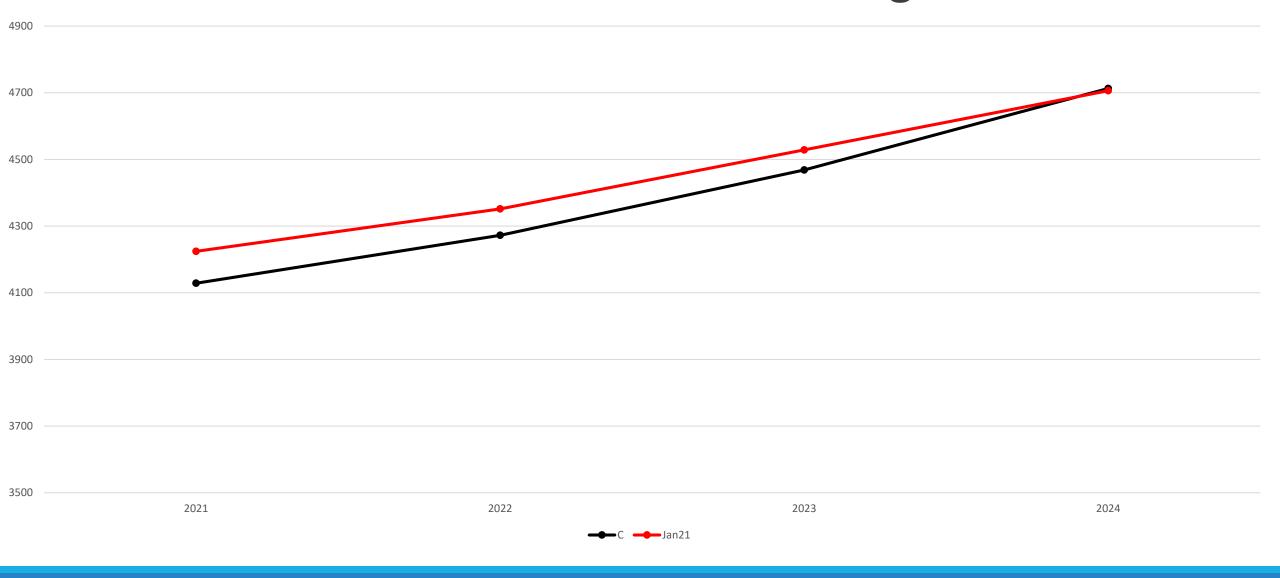
- Raise Taxes

- Cut Spending







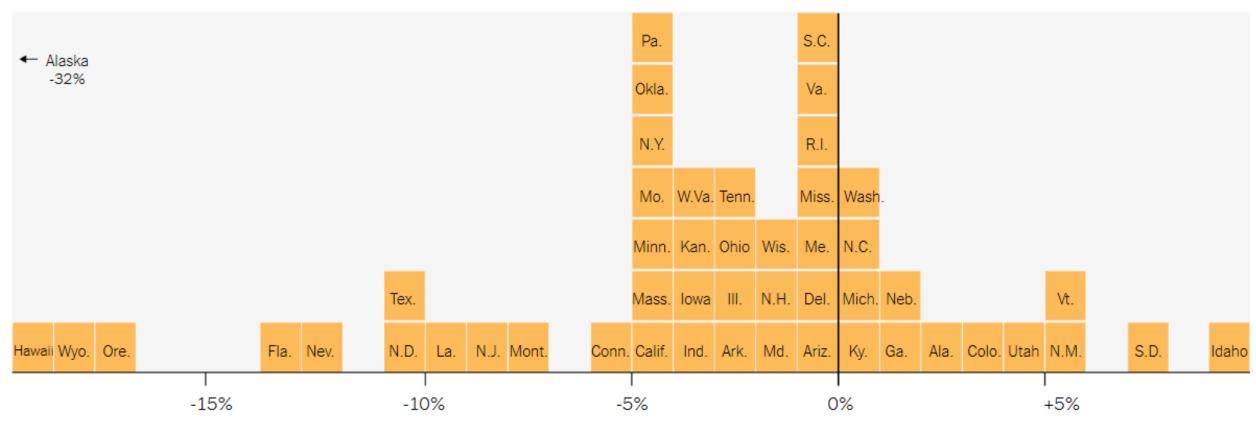




Comparison of State Revenue Impacts

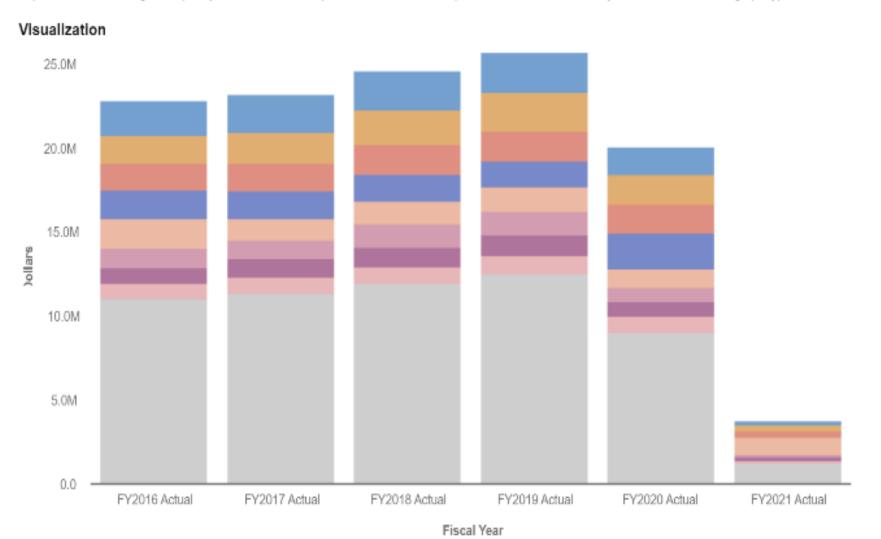

- •JFAC Interim Committee discussed options for \$51,056,400 of public schools General Fund reductions
- The Governor's budget impacts only discretionary funds, not statutory distributions
- More than \$400 million in current and anticipated federal funds to cover these discretionary funds
- Net-zero adjustment for temporary rule that allows average weekly FTE student enrollment to be used for attendance reporting when calculating support units

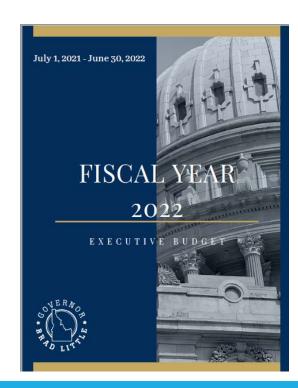

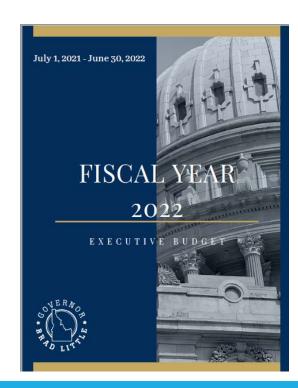

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Topline Summary

- •Education Remains Top Priority. Funding for K-12 grows 16% this year and 5.4% next year.
- •Invests in Economic Stimulus Projects. The budget includes Governor Little's *Building Idaho's Future* \$332 million investment package.
- •Provides Tax Relief. More than \$455 million in tax relief for Idaho families and small businesses.
- •Leaves a Prudent Surplus. Leaves a projected ending balance of \$185 million this year and \$138 million next year, ensuring a cushion for economic uncertainty.
- •Bolsters Rainy Day Funds. Bolsters state rainy day funds by \$230 million, augmenting the state's preparedness for economic uncertainty as federal funding tapers off.
- •Strengthens Public Health Response. More than \$250 million to respond to COVID-19.
