On behalf of the various guardian ad litem (GAL) programs statewide, the Supreme Court requests \$415,200 in ongoing trustee and benefit payments from the General Fund for various staff positions. Pursuant to Section 16-1602(22), Idaho Code, the Supreme Court is the grant administrator of funds distributed to qualified recipients, such as the Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA)/GAL Boards in the seven judicial districts. These funds are used to recruit, train, and appoint a GAL in each Child Protective Act (CPA) proceeding involving a child under the age of 12, and in some involving children over the age of 12, as required by Section 16-1614, Idaho Code. GALs conduct independent factual investigations and advocate for the best interests of the child at each stage of CPA proceedings. Further, GALs are now involved in placement decisions made by the Department of Health and Welfare, pursuant to Section 16-1629(8), Idaho Code. By judicial district, the GAL/CASA programs request the following:

First Judicial District: \$153,100 for two full-time advocate coordinators and a full-time data and compliance manager. The advocate coordinators will supervise and assist with case management; and the data and compliance manager will maintain reports in compliance with national CASA standards.

Fourth Judicial District: \$150,000 for two full-time advocate coordinators and a full-time youth coordinator. The advocate coordinators will supervise and assist with case management; and the youth coordinator will develop training curriculum and specialize in expansion cases under Idaho Juvenile Rule 16.

Fifth Judicial District: \$48,000 for two part-time advocate coordinators to supervise and assist with case management.

Sixth Judicial District: \$43,100 for a full-time advocate coordinator to supervise and assist with case management (\$41,600), and operating funds (\$1,500).

Seventh Judicial District: \$21,000 for a part-time advocate coordinator to supervise and assist with case management.

NOTE: After the revision deadline, but prior to publication, the Supreme Court notified LSO that the Fourth Judicial District's GAL program withdrew one of the advocate coordinator positions from its request. This reduces the Fourth Judicial District's request to \$100,000 and the statewide amount to \$365,200.
