## SENATE BILL NO. 1192

## BY FINANCE COMMITTEE

## AN ACT

1 APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION FOR FISCAL  
 2 YEAR 2010; LIMITING THE NUMBER OF AUTHORIZED FULL-TIME EQUIVA-  
 3 LENT POSITIONS; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE INTENT ON PERSONNEL COSTS;  
 4 DIRECTING SALARY REDUCTIONS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.  
 5

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

7 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Correction the follow-  
 8 ing amounts to be expended for the designated programs according to the designated expense  
 9 classes from the listed funds for the period July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2010:

19 SECTION 2. In accordance with Section 67-3519, Idaho Code, the Department  
20 of Correction is authorized no more than one thousand six hundred twenty-six and  
21 eight-tenths (1,626.8) full-time equivalent positions at any point during the period July 1, 2009,  
22 through June 30, 2010, for the programs specified in Section 1 of this act, unless specifically  
23 authorized by the Governor. The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee will be notified  
24 promptly of any increased positions so authorized.

25 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the Legislature to retain to the  
26 extent possible, our capable, quality employees who support the essential services and statuto-  
27 rily authorized programs that the citizens of Idaho expect. The Legislature finds these critical  
28 essential services to be those that maintain the health and safety of our citizens and the ed-  
29 ucation of our children. While extending flexibility to the Governor and agency directors to  
30 manage the state workforce to the best of their ability during these difficult times, it remains the  
31 responsibility of the Legislature to identify priorities for the state workforce. The Legislature  
32 finds that reductions in personnel funding shall first be managed through salary reductions that  
33 impact all personnel fairly; secondly, be mitigated by the use of existing salary savings; thirdly,  
34 by using savings created by keeping newly vacated positions unfilled; fourth, by the use of fur-  
35 loughs; and lastly, as a last resort, by reducing the workforce. It is the intent of the Legislature  
36 that these policies shall be adhered to by the executive, legislative, and judicial branches to the  
37 extent allowed by law.

38 SECTION 4. SALARY REDUCTION. Inasmuch as salary reductions will save jobs; and  
39 inasmuch as a five percent (5%) reduction in personnel funding may create a reduction in force;  
40 and inasmuch as the state as a single employer of multiple departments and agencies is required

1 by law to direct across the board salary adjustments; agencies and institutions shall reduce all  
2 salaries of classified and nonclassified employees, regardless of fund source, by three percent  
3 (3%) for fiscal year 2010, beginning on June 14, 2009, through June 12, 2010. Agencies shall  
4 use personnel cost savings, furloughs, and a reduction in force to manage the remaining two  
5 percent (2%) in funding reductions. The Division of Human Resources shall adjust all pay  
6 schedules for the classified personnel system downward to the extent that all beginning mini-  
7 mum salaries are three percent (3%) less than those in effect upon the date of passage of this  
8 law.

9 SECTION 5. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to  
10 exist, Section 4 of this act shall be in full force and effect on and after passage and approval.
