1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2 STATING LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND HONORING THE 2009 SPECIAL OLYMPICS
3 WORLD WINTER GAMES AND THE IDAHO OPTOMETRIC PHYSICIANS
4 WHO WILL PARTICIPATE IN THE VISUAL SCREEN FOR THE 2009 SPECIAL
5 OLYMPICS WORLD WINTER GAMES.

6 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

7 WHEREAS, after a successful bid for the 2009 Special Olympics World Winter Games,
8 the host site was awarded to Boise, Idaho, for the 2009 Special Olympics World Winter Games
9 to be held February 7 through 13, 2009; and

10 WHEREAS, more than three thousand athletes from eighty-five countries and regions of
11 the world are expected to compete in seven Olympic-type winter events; and

12 WHEREAS, the 2009 Special Olympics World Winter Games will be the largest multi-
13 sport event ever held in the state of Idaho; and

14 WHEREAS, the Idaho Optometric Physicians have volunteered hundreds of hours to
15 participate in the visual screen for the 2009 Special Olympics World Winter Games Special
16 Olympians.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the First Regular Session of
18 the Sixtieth Idaho Legislature, the Senate and the House of Representatives concurring therein,
19 that a welcome be extended to all the participating athletes and guests who have come to Idaho
20 for the 2009 Special Olympics World Winter Games, and a thank you be extended to all the
21 Idaho Optometric Physicians that have taken time from their practices to help with the 2009
22 Special Olympics World Winter Games.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate be, and she is hereby
24 directed to send a copy of this resolution to the head of the Idaho Optometric Physicians who
25 will be doing the visual screen for the 2009 Special Olympics World Winter Games.
