HOUSE BILL NO. 532

BY RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

AN ACT

1 RELATING TO FISH AND GAME; AMENDING SECTION 36-111, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE  
2 FOR MONEYS RECEIVED FROM THE SALE OF CONSERVATION PERMITS; AMENDING  
3 CHAPTER 4, TITLE 36, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION  
4 36-409B, IDAHO CODE, TO AUTHORIZE THE FISH AND GAME COMMISSION TO  
5 PROMULGATE RULES RELATING TO THE ENTRY UPON CERTAIN DEPARTMENT LANDS  
6 AND TO PROVIDE FOR CONSERVATION PERMITS; AMENDING SECTION 36-416,  
7 IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE FOR FEES FOR CONSERVATION PERMITS; AND AMENDING  
8 SECTION 36-1401, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT CERTAIN CONDUCT SHALL  
9 CONSTITUTE AN INFRACTION.

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

12 SECTION 1. That Section 36-111, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby  
13 amended to read as follows:

14 36-111. FISH AND GAME SET-ASIDE ACCOUNT. (1) There is hereby  
15 established the fish and game set-aside account in the dedicated fund.  
16 The account shall have paid into it moneys as follows:

17 (a) Four dollars (\$4.00) of each steelhead trout or anadromous salmon  
18 permit sold. Moneys from this source shall be used for the acquisition,  
19 development and maintenance of parking areas, access sites, boat ramps  
20 and sanitation facilities in salmon and steelhead fishing areas, for  
21 management of and research on steelhead trout and anadromous salmon  
22 problems, and for technical assistance with litigation concerning  
23 steelhead and anadromous salmon originating in Idaho.

24 (b) Two dollars (\$2.00) from each combination hunting and fishing  
25 license, or each hunting license sold, as provided in sections 36-406  
26 and 36-407, Idaho Code, except that class 4 licenses shall be exempt  
27 from this provision. Moneys from this source shall be used for the  
28 purposes of acquiring access to and acquiring and rehabilitating big  
29 game ranges and upland bird and waterfowl habitats. Unless it is  
30 inconsistent with the goals of the commission, it is the intent of  
31 the legislature that the commission negotiate lease arrangements as  
32 compared with outright purchase of private property.

33 (c) One dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) from each antelope, elk and  
34 deer tag sold as provided in section 36-409, Idaho Code. Not less than  
35 seventy-five cents (75¢) of each one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50)  
36 collected shall be placed in a separate account to be designated as a  
37 feeding account. Moneys in this account shall be used exclusively for  
38 the purposes of winter feeding of and rehabilitation of winter range  
39 for antelope, elk and deer. The balance of moneys realized from this  
40 source may be used for the control of depredation of private property  
41 by antelope, elk and deer and control of predators affecting antelope,  
42 elk and deer. Moneys in the feeding account shall not be used for any

1 purpose other than winter feeding as herein specified until the total  
2 funds in the account, including any interest earnings thereon, equal or  
3 exceed four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000). Moneys in the feeding  
4 account may not be expended except upon the declaration of a feeding  
5 emergency by the director of the department of fish and game. Such  
6 emergency need not exist on a statewide basis but can be declared with  
7 respect to one (1) or more regions of the state. The department shall by  
8 rule establish the criteria for a feeding emergency.

9 (d) Those amounts designated by individuals in accordance with section  
10 63-3067A(3) (a), Idaho Code, and from fees paid under the provisions of  
11 section 49-417, Idaho Code. Moneys from these sources shall be used for  
12 a nongame management and protection program under the direction of the  
13 fish and game commission.

14 (e) Unless inconsistent with funding or management agreements  
15 directing program income, forty percent (40%) of moneys received,  
16 in accordance with section 36-409B, Idaho Code, shall be used for  
17 the maintenance and operation of department owned, leased or managed  
18 sites, not including those private lands enrolled in ACCESS YES; twenty  
19 percent (20%) shall be used for development and implementation of  
20 noxious weed biological control; and the remainder may be used for  
21 the department's nongame program or for the purposes stated in this  
22 paragraph (e).

23 (f) Money derived from the assessment of processing fees. Moneys  
24 derived from this source shall be used as provided in section 36-1407,  
25 Idaho Code.

26 (2) Moneys in the fish and game set-aside account and the feeding  
27 account established in subsection (1)(c) of this section are subject to  
28 appropriation, and the provisions of section 67-3516, Idaho Code. Moneys in  
29 the fish and game set-aside account and the feeding account shall be invested  
30 by the state treasurer in the manner provided for investment of idle state  
31 moneys in the state treasury by section 67-1210, Idaho Code, with interest  
32 earned on investments from each account to be paid into that account.

33 SECTION 2. That Chapter 4, Title 36, Idaho Code, be, and the same is  
34 hereby amended by the addition thereto of a NEW SECTION, to be known and  
35 designated as Section 36-409B, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

36 36-409B. ACCESS TO DEPARTMENT LANDS. The commission is authorized  
37 to promulgate rules specifying department lands for which a conservation  
38 permit, hunting, fishing or trapping license is required for entry and  
39 establishing exceptions to such requirements. A conservation permit may be  
40 had by a resident or nonresident upon payment of a fee as specified in section  
41 36-416, Idaho Code.

42 SECTION 3. That Section 36-416, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby  
43 amended to read as follows:

12 SECTION 4. That Section 36-1401, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby  
13 amended to read as follows:

14 36-1401. VIOLATIONS. (a) Infractions. Any person who pleads guilty to  
15 or is found guilty of a violation of the following provisions of the fish  
16 and game code or the following rules or proclamations promulgated pursuant  
17 thereto is guilty of an infraction:

18 1. Statutes.

19 (A) Take, transport, use or have in possession bait fish as set  
20 forth in section 36-902(d), Idaho Code.

21 (B) Chumming as set forth in section 36-902(e), Idaho Code.

22 (C) Nonresident child under the age of fourteen (14) years fishing  
23 without a valid license and not accompanied by a valid license  
24 holder as set forth in section 36-401(a)2., Idaho Code.

25 (D) Use or cut a hole larger than ten (10) inches in the ice for ice  
26 fishing as set forth in section 36-1509(a), Idaho Code.

27 (E) Store fish without required tags/permits/statements as set  
28 forth in section 36-503, Idaho Code.

29 (F) Own, possess or harbor any dog found running loose and which  
30 is tracking, pursuing, harassing or attacking a big game animal as  
31 set forth in section 36-1101(b)6.(B), Idaho Code.

32 (G) Hunt migratory waterfowl without having in possession a  
33 signed federal migratory bird hunting stamp as set forth in  
34 section 36-1102(b)2., Idaho Code.

35 (H) Hunt migratory game birds without having in possession  
36 a license validated for the federal migratory bird harvest  
37 information program permit as set forth in section 36-409(k),  
38 Idaho Code.

39 (I) Trap in or on, destroy or damage any muskrat house as provided  
40 in section 36-1103(c), Idaho Code.

41 (J) Hunt migratory game birds with a shotgun capable of holding  
42 more than three (3) shells as provided and incorporated in section  
43 36-1102(b), Idaho Code.

44 2. Rules or Proclamations.

1 (A) Fish from a raft or boat with motor attached in waters where  
2 motors are prohibited.

3 (B) Fish with hooks larger than allowed in that water.

4 (C) Fish with barbed hooks in waters where prohibited.

5 (D) Exceed any established bag limit for fish by one (1) fish,  
6 except bag limits for anadromous fish, landlocked chinook salmon,  
7 kamloops rainbow trout, lake trout, or bull trout.

8 (E) Fish with more than the approved number of lines or hooks.

9 (F) Fail to leave head and/or tail on fish while fish are in  
10 possession or being transported.

11 (G) Snag or hook fish other than in the head and fail to release,  
12 excluding anadromous fish.

13 (H) Fail to attend fishing line and keep it under surveillance at  
14 all times.

15 (I) Fail to comply with mandatory check and report requirements.

16 (J) Fail to leave evidence of sex or species attached as required  
17 on game birds.

18 (K) Hunt or take migratory game birds or upland game birds with  
19 shot exceeding the allowable size.

20 (L) Fail to release, report or turn in nontarget trapped animals.

21 (M) Fail to complete required report on trapped furbearer.

22 (N) Fail to present required furbearer animal parts for  
23 inspection.

24 (O) Fail to attach identification tags to traps.

25 (P) Possess not more than one (1) undersized bass.

26 (Q) Park or camp in a restricted area, except length of stay  
27 violations.

28 (R) Fail to leave evidence of sex attached as required on game  
29 animals.

30 (S) Entry upon designated department lands without a valid  
31 conservation permit, hunting, fishing or trapping license.

32 (b) Misdemeanors. Any person who pleads guilty to, is found guilty  
33 or is convicted of a violation of the provisions of this title or rules or  
34 proclamations promulgated pursuant thereto, or orders of the commission,  
35 except where an offense is expressly declared to be an infraction or felony,  
36 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

37 (c) Felonies. Any person who pleads guilty to, is found guilty or  
38 is convicted of a violation of the following offenses shall be guilty of a  
39 felony:

40 1. Knowingly and intentionally selling or offering for sale or  
41 exchange, or purchasing or offering to purchase or exchange, any  
42 wildlife, or parts thereof, which has been unlawfully killed, taken or  
43 possessed.

44 2. Releasing into the wild, without a permit from the director, any of  
45 the following wildlife, whether native or exotic: ungulates, bears,  
46 wolves, large felines, swine, or peccaries.

47 3. Unlawfully killing, possessing or wasting of any combination of  
48 numbers or species of wildlife within a twelve (12) month period which  
49 has a single or combined reimbursable damage assessment of more than one  
50 thousand dollars (\$1,000), as provided in section 36-1404, Idaho Code.

1 4. Conviction within ten (10) years of three (3) or more violations of  
2 the provisions of this title, penalties for which include either or both  
3 a mandatory license revocation or a reimbursable damage assessment.
