HOUSE AMENDMENT TO H.B. NO. 667

AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1

1
2 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 31 through 41; and on page 2,
3 delete lines 1 and 2, and insert:

4 "(5) Public health districts shall have all proposed rules regarding
5 environmental protection or programs administered by the department of en-
6 vironmental quality submitted for review and comment to the state board of
7 environmental quality and such rules must be approved by adoption of a con-
8 current resolution by both houses of the legislature or such rules shall ex-
9 pire at the conclusion of a regular session of the legislature. It is the
10 intent of the legislature that standards and rules relating to subsurface
11 sewage systems, wastewater treatment, sewage systems and water quality be
12 consistent statewide."

13 AMENDMENT TO THE BILL

14 On page 2, following line 2, insert:

15 "SECTION 2. That, having found that the following rules violate the
16 legislative intent of the statute under which the rules were adopted, IDAPA
17 41.01.01.901; IDAPA 41.01.01.100.02; and IDAPA 41.01.01.100.06 shall be
18 null, void and of no force and effect at the conclusion of the Second Regular
19 Session of the Sixtieth Idaho Legislature.

20 SECTION 3. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby
21 declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its
22 passage and approval."

23 CORRECTION TO TITLE

24 On page 1, delete lines 3 through 6, and insert: "PROVIDE THAT CERTAIN
25 RULES OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH DISTRICTS BE SUBMITTED FOR REVIEW AND COMMENT BY
26 THE STATE BOARD OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY, TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH RULES EXPIRE
27 AT THE END OF A REGULAR SESSION OF THE LEGISLATURE IF NOT APPROVED BY CONCUR-
28 RENT RESOLUTION AND TO PROVIDE LEGISLATIVE INTENT REGARDING CERTAIN RULES;
29 DECLARING CERTAIN RULES NULL, VOID AND OF NO FORCE AND EFFECT AT THE END OF
30 THE SECOND REGULAR SESSION OF THE SIXTIETH IDAHO LEGISLATURE; AND DECLARING
31 AN EMERGENCY."
